25	SECTION 1. Arkansas	Code Title 17, Chapter 8	30, is amended to add an
26	additional subchapter to r	ead as follows:	
27	Subchapter 4 — Arkans	as Safe and Effective Pre	escribing Practices Act
28			
29	17-80-401. Title.		
30	This subchapter shal	l be known and may be cit	ted as the "Arkansas Safe
31	and Effective Prescribing	Practices Act".	
32			
33	17-80-402. Definiti	ons.	
34	As used in this subc	hapter:	

1	(1) "Prescriber" means an individual who is licensed, certified,		
2	registered, or otherwise authorized by the appropriate Arkansas licensing		
3	board to prescribe drugs in the course of professional practice;		
4	(2) "Opioid" means a drug or medication that relieves pain		
5	including without limitation:		
6	(A) Hydrocodone;		
7	(B) Oxycodone;		
8	(C) Morphine; and		
9	(D) Codeine; and		
10	(3) "Treatment guidelines" means evidence-based recommendations		
11	to assist healthcare providers in making patient decisions concerning		
12	appropriate medical care for the treatment of acute and chronic pain.		
13			
14	17-80-403. Arkansas Task Force for Safe and Effective Prescribing		
15	<u>Practices - Creation - Membership.</u>		
16	(a) The Arkansas Task Force for Safe and Effective Prescribing		
17	Practices is created.		
18	(b) The task force shall consist of the following health officials and		
19	representatives from healthcare provider licensing boards:		
20	(1) The State Health Officer or his or her designee;		
21	(2) The Surgeon General or his or her designee;		
22	(3) The Director of the Division of Medical Services of the		
23	Department of Human Services or his or her designee;		
24	(4) The Arkansas Drug Director or his or her designee;		
25	(5) The Director of the Department of Arkansas State Police or		
26	his or her designee; and		
27	(6) One (1) board member designated by each of the following		
28	organizations who is also professional licensee of the organization:		
29	(A) The Arkansas State Board of Dental Examiners;		
30	(B) The Arkansas State Board of Nursing;		
31	(C) The Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy; and		
32	(D) The Arkansas State Medical Board.		
33	(c) A meeting of the task force shall be open to the public and		
34	subject to the Freedom of Information Act of 1967, § 25-19-101 et seq.

36	17-80-404. Treatment guidelines.		

1	(a) On or before October 1, 2015, the Arkansas Task Force for Safe and		
2	Effective Prescribing Practices shall develop treatment guidelines for the		
3	prescribing of opioids that can be used by prescribers in the state as a		
4	guide for patient care.		
5	(b) By September 30 of each year, the task force shall review and		
6	update, as needed, the treatment guidelines for the prescribing of opioids.		
7	(c) A state licensing board that licenses or otherwise regulates		
8	prescribers shall adopt and post on its website:		
9	(1) The treatment guidelines for the prescribing of opioids		
10	developed by the task force on or before March 1, 2016; and		
11	(2) Updated treatment guidelines for the prescribing of opioids		
12	within six (6) months of the development of updated treatment guidelines by		
13	the task force.		
14	(d) A state licensing board that licenses or otherwise regulates		
15	<pre>prescribers shall:</pre>		
16	(1) Provide training materials to its licensees on the treatment		
17	guidelines for the prescribing of opioids as developed and updated by the		
18	task force; and		
19	(2) Promulgate rules on or before March 1, 2016, to require		
20	continuing education on the abuse of controlled substances as a condition of		
21	license renewal for prescribers.		
22			
23	17-80-405. Patient treatment and applicability.		
24	(a) The guidelines for the prescribing of opioids shall be developed		
25	to assist prescriber decision-making only and shall not have the effect of		
26	law.		
27	(b) This subchapter does not prohibit a prescriber who uses opioids to		
28	relieve a patient's pain from prescribing a dosage of opioids deemed		
29	medically necessary to relieve the patient's pain.
