3	REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE NINETIETH ARKANSAS
4	GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO REFER TO THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE,
5	FORESTRY, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT A STUDY OF THE ARKANSAS NATIVE
6	WINES INCENTIVE GRANTS PROGRAM.

8	WHEREAS, Arkansas is the oldest and largest grape juice and wine-
9	producing state in the southern United States; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, grapes were first grown commercially in Arkansas by a colon
12	of German-Swiss immigrants who settled at Altus, Franklin County, in the
13	1870s; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, there are now wineries in Arkansas with a storage capacity
16	exceeding one million two hundred thousand gallons (1,200,000 gal.); and
17	
18	WHEREAS, the Arkansas native wines incentive grants program was
19	enacted by Act 681 of 1985; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, the purposes of the incentive grant program include:
22	(1) Reducing unemployment and providing new job opportunities
23	(2) Providing expanded markets for grapes, fruits, berries, or
24	vegetables produced in Arkansas;
25	(3) Attracting other industries to this state;
26	(4) Providing stability to the marketing of grapes used in the
27	wine industries of this state;
28	(5) Providing relief to Arkansas wineries which must compete
29	with products imported from foreign countries whose producers are receiving
30	direct government subsidies; and
31	(6) Providing relief to the financial community of this state
32	which made investments and loans supporting the growers of grapes, fruits,
33	berries, and vegetables used in the wine industry; and

WHEREAS, developing economic, social, and agricultural conditions over the past thirty (30) years are reshaping the wine industries of this state; WHEREAS, a comprehensive review of the incentive grant program would benefit the wine industries of this state and the state's agricultural economy generally, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the Legislative Council of the Ninetieth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas refer to the House Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, and Economic Development a study of the Arkansas Native Wines Incentive Grants Program.
