16	qualified applicants be granted admission to the College of Medicine of the
17	University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences; and

19	WHEREAS, the admission of the most qualified applicants to the College
20	of Medicine of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences will ensure
21	that those students who are admitted are more likely to graduate and that the
22	money of the taxpayers of this state is well-spent,
23	
24	NOW THEREFORE,
25	BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND LABOR OF
26	THE NINETIETH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
27	
28	THAT the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor study
29	whether the General Assembly should remove the admissions requirement that
30	the College of Medicine of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
31	allocate the first seventy percent (70%) of the first one hundred fifty (150)
32	positions for the freshman medical class among the congressional districts in
33	the state.

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BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT by July 1, 2018, the study be completed and a
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     report presented to the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor
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     with findings and recommendations from the study.
