4	LABOR STUDY THE USE OF GLOBAL SIGNATURE AUTHORITY FOR AN ADVANCED

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7	WHEREAS, global signature authority is the authorization to allow
8	certain healthcare professionals to sign or otherwise complete forms related
9	to patient care within their scope of practice; and
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11	WHEREAS, some examples of the forms related to patient care are:
12	(1) Providing certification of disability for patients to
13	receive disabled parking placards;
14	(2) Signing off on physicals for student athletes or school bus
15	drivers;
16	(3) Signing forms related to end-of-life care;
17	(4) Signing forms excusing a potential jury member due to
18	illness;
19	(5) Signing worker's compensation forms for employees injured on
20	the job; and
21	(6) Signing valid information certificates such as birth
22	certificates and death certificates; and
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24	WHEREAS, dozens of forms relating to the daily provision of care for a
25	patient may need to be signed to ensure the fulfillment of orders, referrals,
26	or recognition of care by various entities; and
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28	WHEREAS, some state laws may prohibit governmental entities or private
29	companies from recognizing the signature of an advanced practice registered
30	nurse by limiting the signature to only physicians; and
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32	WHEREAS, twelve (12) states (Colorado, Georgia, Hawaii, Maine,
33	Massachusetts, New Mexico, North Carolina, Rhoda Island, Vermont, Virginia,
34	Washington, and West Virginia) have enacted global signature authority; and
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1 WHEREAS, other states have recognized the ability of an advanced 2 practice registered nurse to sign all state forms within his or her scope of practice by including advanced practice registered nurses in each relevant 3 4 statute or rule; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas requires both an advanced practice 7 registered nurse and a collaborating physician to sign forms that reflect the 8 care that the advanced practice registered nurse has provided; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the additional requirement can create significant delays in patient care and cause unnecessary costs on follow-up visits for the 11 12 completion of the forms; and 13 WHEREAS, global signature authority legislation helps promote: 14 15 (1) Transparency and accountability by allowing documentation to 16 reflect the patient-provider relationship; 17 (2) Efficacy for patients as care delivery and form completion can be addressed in the same visit; and 18 19 (3) Productive use of healthcare workforce by eliminating the 20 need for involvement of two (2) healthcare professionals to sign, stamp, 21 certify, or endorse one (1) patient's forms; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the General Assembly should pursue efforts to improve 24 healthcare access by allowing advanced practice registered nurses to have 25 global signature authority, 26 27 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND LABOR OF 28 29 THE NINETIETH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 30 THAT the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor study the 31 32 use of global signature authority for an advanced practice registered nurse 33 in other states. 34

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BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT, upon request, the Arkansas State Board of
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     Nursing and the Department of Health shall provide assistance to the House
     Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor to perform this study.
