3	REQUESTING THAT THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE,

6	WHEREAS, each year, approximately six hundred ninety-eight thousand
7	(698,000) Arkansans provide care for a family member with a disability or
8	mental illness or who is aging; and

10	WHEREAS, the total hours of caregiving given by Arkansans in this
11	situation exceeds four hundred fifty million (450,000,000) hours annually;
12	and
13	
14	WHEREAS, the value of family care provided in Arkansas in this type of
15	situation is approximately four billion five hundred million dollars
16	(\$4,500,000,000) per year; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, with ten thousand (10,000) persons retiring each day in the
19	United States, the demand for long-term care services and supports will
20	increase sharply in the coming years; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, the demands of caregiving take a toll on the family members
23	who provide care; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, one (1) in six (6) people report that caregiving has made
26	their health worse; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, sixty percent (60%) of family caregivers reported fair or poor
29	health, one (1) or more chronic conditions, or a disability, which is a
30	significant contrast to thirty-three percent (33%) of non-cargivers; and

32	WHEREAS, the demands of caregiving over time can lead to the disabled
33 34	family member being placed in a nursing home or other institution outside of the home; and

1 WHEREAS, respite care, or a break from caregiving, can provide relief 2 from the demands of caregiving and therefore allow disabled family members to continue to live in the home; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas has few options for respite care from 6 state funded programs or community-based programs; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the General Assembly should investigate the state of respite 9 care across the state, 10 11 NOW THEREFORE, 12 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND LABOR OF 13 THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 14 15 THAT the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor study 16 respite care within the State of Arkansas. 17 18 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT, upon request, the following entities 19 provide assistance to the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and 20 Labor to perform this study: 21 (1) The Division of Developmental Disabilities Services of the 22 Department of Human Services; 23 (2) The Division of Aging and Adult Services of the Department 24 of Human Services; 25 (3) The Division of Behavioral Health Services of the Department 26 of Human Services; 27 The Division of Medical Services of the Department of Human 28 Services; 29 (5) The Arkansas AARP; 30 The Partners for Inclusive Communities; (6) 31 (7) The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Arkansas; 32 The Arkansas Waiver Association: (8) 33 (9) The Arkansas Developmental Disabilities Provider 34 Association; and 35 The Area Agencies on Aging.
