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INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2017-092
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REQUESTING THAT THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY STUDY THE LEGAL 3 AND POLICY RAMIFICATIONS OF A PERSON'S LEGAL OR ILLEGAL 4 POSSESSION OF A FIREARM IN AN ESTABLISHMENT THAT SERVES ALCOHOLIC 5 6 BEVERAGES FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE ESTABLISHMENT'S PREMISES. 7 8 WHEREAS, even before the passage of Acts 2017, Nos. 562 and 859, there 9 was confusion as to what extent a person could legally carry a firearm into 10 an establishment that serves alcoholic beverages for consumption on the 11 establishment's premises, either under the criminal law or under the

12 administrative concealed handgun licensing framework at Ark. Code Ann. § 5-13 73-301 et seq.; and

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WHEREAS, the mass shooting at the Power Ultra Lounge on July 1, 2017, in Little Rock, highlighted the dangers inherent in the possession and illegal discharge of a firearm in an establishment that serves alcoholic beverages for consumption on the establishment's premises; and

20 WHEREAS, the Senate Committee on Judiciary should study the possession 21 of a firearm in an establishment that serves alcoholic beverages for 22 consumption on the establishment's premises from the vantage point of whether the criminal law is sufficient to deter illegal firearm possession as well as 23 24 whether the state's public policy is sufficiently addressing both the causes 25 and effects of a person's possession of a firearm in an establishment that 26 serves alcoholic beverages for consumption on the establishment's premises; 27 and

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WHEREAS, the study should encompass a determination of the meaning of "an establishment that serves alcoholic beverages for consumption on the establishment's premises" and whether that meaning currently does, does not, or should include a restaurant, lounge, bar, pub, microbrewery, or special event held on another party's premises; and

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WHEREAS, the study should also include an evaluation of whether the
 General Assembly should revisit legislation such as House Bill 1299 of 2017

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     or House Bill 1817 of 2017, which addressed the possession of a firearm by a
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     person under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance; and
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           WHEREAS, the study should further include a discussion concerning the
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     available penalties currently provided for under the law or that should be
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     considered by the General Assembly for those instances when a concealed carry
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     licensee improperly possesses a concealed handgun in an establishment that
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     serves alcoholic beverages for consumption on the establishment's premises,
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    NOW THEREFORE,
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     BE IT PROPOSED BY THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY OF THE NINETY-FIRST
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     GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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           THAT the Senate Committee on Judiciary study the legal and policy
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     ramifications of a person's legal or illegal possession of a firearm in an
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     establishment that serves alcoholic beverages for consumption on the
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     establishment's premises.
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           BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT the House Committee on Judiciary be invited
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     to participate in the study.
