31	(a) The General Ass	sembly finds that:		
32	(1) Advanced	practice registered nurses are	nurses with a	
33	Master's or doctorate degi	ree in nursing and clinical comp	etencies in	
34	-	populations in a variety of set	<del></del>	
35	(2) Advanced	practice registered nurses are	nationally certified	
36	and practice in all fifty	(50) states;		

1	(3) Twenty-two (22) states, two (2) territories, and the		
2	District of Columbia authorize advanced practice registered nurses to have		
3	full practice authority that includes full prescriptive authority without		
4	<pre>supervision;</pre>		
5	(4) Over fifty (50) years of research consistently supports the		
6	high quality and cost-effectiveness of advanced practice registered nurses;		
7	(5) Since the 1960s, studies have found no difference in health		
8	outcomes, including patient health status, number of prescriptions written,		
9	return visits requested, or referral to other providers, of care delivered by		
10	an advanced practice registered nurse or physician;		
11	(6) Collaborative practice agreements do not add patient safety		
12	or added value to the healthcare system, but add to the cost of care for the		
13	<pre>consumer;</pre>		
14	(7) Negative impacts of mandatory collaborative practice		
15	agreements include without limitation:		
16	(A) Potential interruption or closing of an advanced		
17	practice registered nurse-operated clinic due to a loss of a collaborative		
18	practice physician;		
19	(B) Significant added cost to overhead of the practice due		
20	to higher fees charged by many collaborative physicians;		
21	(C) Added paperwork for the advanced practice registered		
22	nurse and the physician, which adds to the cost of care;		
23	(D) Decreased healthcare access by adding a barrier for		
24	advanced practice registered nurses who would like to establish a new clinic;		
25	(E) Inhibits the establishment of new healthcare access		
26	points in rural and medically underserved areas of the state; and		
27	(F) Acts as a disincentive to remain in the state to		
28	practice for new graduates of Arkansas advanced practice registered nurse		
29	programs;		
30	(8) The following major groups and organizations support full		
31	practice authority for advanced practice registered nurses:		
32	(A) The National Governors Association;		
33	(B) The National Academy of Medicine;		
34	(C) The American Association of Retired Persons;		
35	(D) The Federal Trade Commission; and		
36	(E) The National Council of State Boards of Nursing; and		

1	(9) The State of Arkansas should modernize scope of practice		
2	laws for advanced practice registered nurses by removing the mandatory		
3	collaborative practice agreement.		
4	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to:		
5	(1) Increase patient access to health care, reduce healthcare		
6	costs, and promote efficient and timely health care in the State of Arkansas;		
7	<u>and</u>		
8	(2) Authorize advanced practice registered nurses to have full		
9	prescriptive authority, which also means to have the ability to prescribe,		
10	without a collaborative practice agreement.

12	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-87-102(2), concerning the definition of		
13	collaborative practice agreement, is repealed.		
14	(2) "Collaborative practice agreement" means a written plan that		
15	identifies a physician who agrees to collaborate with an advanced practice		
16	registered nurse in the joint management of the health care of the advanced		
17	practice registered nurse's patients and that outlines procedures for		
18	consultation with or referral to the collaborating physician or other		
19	healthcare professional as indicated by a patient's healthcare needs;		
20			
21	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-87-205(b), concerning the Prescriptive		
22	Authority Advisory Committee, is amended to read as follows:		
23	(b) The board shall appoint $\frac{\text{six}}{\text{(6)}}$ five (5) members, to be approved		
24	by the Governor, who have the following qualifications:		
25	(1) Four (4) members shall be advanced practice registered		
26	nurses, at least three (3) of whom hold certificates of prescriptive		
27	authority and an active United States Drug Enforcement Administration		
28	registration number;		
29	(2) One (1) member shall be a licensed physician who has been		
30	involved in a collaborative practice with an advanced practice registered		
31	nurse for at least five (5) years; and		
32	(3) (2) One (1) member shall be a licensed pharmacist who has		
33	been licensed for at least five (5) years.		
34			
35	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-87-310 is amended to read as follows:		
36	17-87-310. Prescriptive authority.		

- 1 (a) The Arkansas State Board of Nursing may grant a certificate of 2 prescriptive authority to an advanced practice registered nurse who÷
- (1) Submits submits proof of successful completion of an

  4 Arkansas State Board of Nursing approved advanced pharmacology course

  5 approved by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing that shall include

  6 preceptorial experience in the prescription of drugs, medicines, and

therapeutic devices; and

- (2) Has a collaborative practice agreement with a practicing physician who is licensed under the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, § 17-95-201 et seq., § 17-95-301 et seq., and § 17-95-401 et seq., and who has training in scope, specialty, or expertise to that of the advanced practice registered nurse on file with the Arkansas State Board of Nursing.
- (b)(1) An advanced practice registered nurse with a certificate of prescriptive authority may receive and prescribe drugs, medicines, or therapeutic devices appropriate to the advanced practice registered nurse's area of practice in accordance with rules established by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing.
- (2) An advanced practice registered nurse's prescriptive authority shall extend only to drugs listed in Schedules III V and, if expressly authorized by the collaborative practice agreement, also to those hydrocodone combination products reclassified from Schedule III to Schedule II as of October 6, 2014.
- (3)(A) The Arkansas State Board of Nursing shall promptly adopt rules applicable to an advance practice registered nurse that are consistent with the Arkansas State Medical Board's rules governing the prescription of dangerous drugs and controlled substances.
- (B) Prior to approval of the Arkansas State Board of
  Nursing's rules, the Arkansas State Medical Board shall review the proposed
  rules and verify that the proposed rules are consistent with the Arkansas
  State Medical Board's rules concerning the prescription of dangerous drugs
  and controlled substances.
- 32 (c) A collaborative practice agreement shall include, but not be
  33 limited to, provisions addressing:
- 34 (1) The availability of the collaborating physician for 35 consultation or referral, or both;

1	(2) Methods of management of the collaborative practice, which
2	shall include protocols for prescriptive authority;
3	(3) Coverage of the healthcare needs of a patient in the
4	emergency absence of the advanced practice registered nurse or physician; and
5	(4) Quality assurance.
6	(d) If a collaborative practice results in complaints of violations of
7	the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, § 17-95-201 et seq., § 17-95-301 et seq.,
8	and § 17-95-401 et seq., the Arkansas State Medical Board may review the role
9	of the physician in the collaborative practice to determine if the physician
10	is unable to manage his or her responsibilities under the agreement without
11	an adverse effect on the quality of care of the patient.
12	(e) If a collaborative practice results in complaints of violations of
13	this chapter, the Arkansas State Board of Nursing may review the role of the
14	advanced practice registered nurse in the collaborative practice to determine
15	if the nurse is unable to manage his or her responsibilities under the
16	agreement without an adverse effect on the quality of care of the patient.
