| 12 | WHEREAS, the Lost 40 is known for its large, mature trees, with some          |
| 13 | trees estimated to be more than two hundred (200) years old and standing more |
| 14 | than one hundred fifty (150') feet tall; and                                  |

| 16 | WHEREAS, the Lost 40 is described generally as a mixed bottomland             |
| 17 | hardwood-loblolly pine forest, with a variety of forest and soil types        |
| 18 | present on the tract of land; and   |

| 20 | WHEREAS, nearly one hundred fifty (150) different species of plants,          |
| 21 | including thirty-eight (38) different varieties of trees, have been           |
| 22 | documented as being present on the tract by the Arkansas Natural Heritage     |

| 25 | WHEREAS, the Lost 40 is currently owned by PotlatchDeltic Corporation         |
| 26 | and is protected by a forty-year cooperative management agreement signed in   |
| 27 | 1996 by PotlatchDeltic Corporation and the Arkansas Natural Heritage          |
| 28 | Commission; and   |

| 30 | WHEREAS, access to the Lost 40 is currently very limited; and                 |

| 32 | WHEREAS, the Lost 40 is believed to be among some of the last remaining       |
| 33 | untouched forests in this state, which makes the Lost 40 a unique area that   |
| 34 | could provide individuals with a rare opportunity to study information on an  |
| 35 | original forest structure in the region and to appreciate the natural beauty  |
| 36 | for which this state is known,  |

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON STATE AGENCIES AND GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the Senate Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs conduct a study of the Lost 40, including a review of the cooperative agreement between PotlatchDeltic Corporation and the Arkansas Natural Heritage Commission, and of the feasibility of the state assuming management of the Lost 40 in order to turn the Lost 40 into a state park for public use.
