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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 10, Subchapter 1, is amended
24	to add an additional section to read as follows:
25	6-10-135. Culturally Relevant and Inclusive Education Practices
26	Advisory Committee.
27	(a) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall establish
28	and appoint members to the Culturally Relevant and Inclusive Education
29	Practices Advisory Committee for the purposes of:
30	(1) Strengthening culturally relevant education practices; and
31	(2) Supporting anti-bias education and appropriate responses to
32	bias.
33	(b) The committee shall include without limitation a geographically,
34	ethnically, and religiously diverse representation of:
35	(1) Teachers;
36	(2) Curriculum specialists;

1	(3) Principals;
2	(4) Superintendents;
3	(5) Advocates;
4	(6) Institutions of higher education;
5	(7) Parents and legal guardians;
6	(8) Members of the General Assembly; and
7	(9) Community-based organizations.
8	(c) The committee shall provide recommendations to the division during
9	the 2021-2022 State Board of Education review and approval of the history and
10	social studies academic standards for content to be added to the history and
11	social studies academic standards, including without limitation:
12	(1) The historical underpinnings of the Holocaust and other
13	genocides in the context of how increased lower levels of hate, ridicule, and
14	dehumanization led to larger acts of violence and state-sponsored
15	discrimination and violence;
16	(2) Slavery and other forms of historical dehumanizing
17	injustices and discrimination;
18	(3) Anti-Semitism, Islamophobia, and other types of
19	discrimination;
20	(4) The ignored and untold history and the indigenous peoples of
21	North America; and
22	(5) The untold histories of other groups that historically have
23	been underrepresented in American and world history.
24	(d) The committee shall provide recommendations for the issuance of
25	division guidelines for public school district personnel and staff regarding
26	the provision of age-appropriate anti-bias education to students, including
27	without limitation:
28	(1) Recognition that anti-bias and anti-discrimination education
29	is the work and responsibility of all staff members within a public school
30	district;
31	(2) An emphasis on diversity and building a community of
32	empathy, respect, understanding, and connection;
33	(3) An examination of how lower levels of hate, ridicule, and
34	dehumanization lead to larger acts of violence, discrimination, and violence;
35	(4) An acknowledgement of:

1	(A) Inequity on the individual level, including without
2	<u>limitation:</u>
3	(i) Biased speech; and
4	(ii) Harassment;
5	(B) Injustice at the institutional and systemic level,
6	including without limitation discrimination; and
7	(C) The harmful impact of inequity and injustice on the
8	community, historically and today;
9	(5) Responses to various forms of racism, bigotry, and
10	discrimination that:
11	(A) Are school-based and classroom-based
12	(B) Are student-centered and have been proven effective;
13	<u>and</u>
14	(C) Promote empathy, respect, understanding, and
15	<pre>connection;</pre>
16	(6) Updates to the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas
17	Public Schools and School Districts that emphasize the causes and
18	ramifications of the Holocaust and other genocides;
19	(7) Meaningful professional development related to culturally
20	relevant and inclusive education practices; and
21	(8) Updates to policies governing:
22	(A) Teacher preparation programs;
23	(B) Teacher licensure; and
24	(C) Professional development requirements for the renewal
25	of teaching licenses.
26	(e) The committee shall provide recommendations under subsections (c)
27	and (d) of this section to the following:
28	(1) The Governor;
29	(2) The state board;
30	(3) The division;
31	(4) The Chair of the House Committee on Education; and
32	(5) The Chair of the Senate Committee on Education.
