3	REQUESTING THAT THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY STUDY THE
4	QUESTION OF WHETHER A PROBATIONER MAY LAWFULLY POSSESS A MEDICAL
5	MARIJUANA CARD AND USE MEDICAL MARIJUANA UNDER THE ARKANSAS
6	MEDICAL MARIJUANA AMENDMENT OF 2016, ARKANSAS CONSTITUTION,
7	AMENDMENT 98, WITHOUT BEING SUBJECT TO SANCTIONS BY THE
8	PROBATIONER'S PROBATION OFFICER OR THE CIRCUIT COURT.
9	
10	WHEREAS, Amendment 98 to the Arkansas Constitution, known as the
11	"Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016", offers constitutional
12	protections from arrest, prosecution, "penalty in any manner", or denial of
13	"any right or privilege" regarding medical marijuana; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, a person placed on supervised probation as a result of a
16	felony conviction is generally prohibited from both ingesting any controlled
17	substance and violating any federal law while on supervised probation; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, Arkansas Code § 5-4-303(b) states that "[t]he court shall
20	provide as an express condition of every suspension or probation that the
21	defendant not commit an offense punishable by imprisonment during the period
22	of suspension or probation"; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, possession and use of marijuana is still a criminal offense
25	under federal law even if a person is permitted under the Arkansas Medical
26	Marijuana Amendment of 2016, Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, to lawfully
27	use medical marijuana; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, the issue of whether a probationer may be sanctioned for
30	possessing or using medical marijuana, which is a right for qualifying
31	persons secured under the Arkansas Constitution, and violating federal law,
32	has caused confusion,
33	
34	NOW THEREFORE,
35	BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY OF THE NINETY-THIRD
36	GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the House Committee on Judiciary study the question of whether a probationer may lawfully possess a medical marijuana card and use medical marijuana under the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016, Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, without being subject to sanctions by the probationer's probation officer or the circuit court.
