3	REQUESTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON CITY, COUNTY, AND LOCAL
4	AFFAIRS TO STUDY THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STRATEGY TO REGULATE
5	DIGITAL ASSET MINING BUSINESSES, ALSO KNOWN AS CRYPTO MINING,
6	WITHIN THE STATE OF ARKANSAS.

8	WHEREAS, the increased circulation of digital currency and adoption of
9	digital transformation have spurred digital asset mining, also known as
10	crypto mining, into a rapidly growing business sector within the United
11	States; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, the business of digital asset mining in the United States has
14	a projected valuation of five billion dollars (\$5,000,000,000) by the year
15	2032; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas has seen an influx of digital asset
18	mining operations in the state in recent years; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, digital asset mining companies create direct and indirect
21	jobs, pay taxes, and provide general economic value to local communities and
22	the state; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, there are many legitimate digital asset mining businesses
25	operating within the state; however, the growth of this business sector has
26	also been capitalized upon by foreign aliens and entities who pose potential
27	threats to the welfare and safety of Arkansans; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, guidance for future industry growth is needed in Arkansas to
30	protect Arkansans from fraudulent or harmful business practices and certain
31	potentially harmful aliens and foreign entities; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, the state should provide for a robust regulatory scheme that
34	allows for the appropriate management of digital asset mining, keeping the
35	health and welfare of Arkansans at the forefront,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON CITY, COUNTY, AND LOCAL AFFAIRS OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the Senate Committee on City, County, and Local Affairs study the development of a strategy to regulate digital asset mining (also known as "crypto mining") businesses within the State of Arkansas, including without limitation: (1) A statewide noise ordinance to address potential health and safety harms to citizens of the state that can be caused by elevated decibel levels; (2) A prohibition on the purchase or acquisition of title to real property by certain aliens or foreign entities such as a prohibited foreign party as defined in § 18-11-802, including without limitation leasehold interests in real property; and (3) The creation of a state regulatory body or modification of an existing board or commission to oversee the regulation and licensure of digital asset mining businesses. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Senate Committee on City, County, and Local Affairs request the participation of the House Committee on City, County, and Local Affairs in the study.
