14	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, the Arkansas Judicial Retirement System,
15	and the Local Police and Fire Retirement System; and
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17	WHEREAS, failure to address the unfunded liabilities of the state's
18	public retirement systems may pose a dire threat to the solvency of the
19	public retirement systems in the future; and
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21	WHEREAS, although the state's public retirement systems offer death
22	benefits to survivors of members in the form of an annuity election by the
23	member, there is no death benefit in the form of a life insurance payment the
24	beneficiary of a deceased member of a public retirement system; and
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26	WHEREAS, other states have pension-owned life insurance provided to the
27	members of their public retirement systems; and
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29	WHEREAS, the provision of further death benefits for the members of the
30	state's public retirement systems could be used to bolster the financial
31	welfare of the public retirement systems and help reduce the state retirement
32	systems' unfunded liability,

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC RETIREMENT AND SOCIAL SECURITY PROGRAMS OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the Joint Committee on Public Retirement and Social Security Programs study the: (1) Various methods available to establish funding for the unfunded liability of each of the publicly supported retirement systems of the state; (2) Possibility of providing death benefits for members of the publicly supported retirement systems of the state other than annuities elected by the systems' members.
