30	WHEREAS, the educational adequacy funding matrix allocates fifty-nine
31	dollars (\$59.00) per pupil for substitute teachers in the foundation funding
32	amount provided under Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305; and
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34	WHEREAS, the results of site visits in 2006 by Lawrence O. Picus and
35	Associates and the Bureau of Legislative Research, as well as a report by the
36	Department of Education indicate that the public school district expenditures

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1 on salaries for substitute teachers may be too low to attract certified 2 teachers; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the No Child Left Behind Act requires that long-term 5 substitute teachers meet the definition of "highly qualified"; and 6 7 WHEREAS, research to date has raised the question as to whether there 8 are a sufficient number of certified teachers available for employment as 9 substitutes; and 10 11 WHEREAS, additional information is needed regarding all of these 12 factors to determine whether the amount of funding provided in the foundation 13 funding formula is sufficient for educational adequacy, 14 15 NOW THEREFORE, 16 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 17 18 19 THAT the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education conduct a 20 study to determine whether there are sufficient numbers of certified teachers 21 in the job market to meet school district needs for substitute teachers. The 22 study should include: (a) How many substitute teachers are needed, including state and 23 24 federal requirements; 25 (b) What the qualifications of those substitute teachers should be; 26 (c) How many certified teachers are available for employment as 27 substitutes; (d) What factors lead a certified teacher to seek employment (or 28 29 decide not to seek employment) as a substitute, including without limitation salary, certification, retirement implications, location, years of 30 31 experience, and subject matter expertise; and 32 (e) Any other factors that the House and Senate Interim Committees on 33 Education should consider for purposes of educational adequacy. 34 35 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education prepare a report detailing the results of the study on or before 36

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1 May 1, 2008.
