22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 2, Chapter 1 is amended to add an
25	additional subchapter to read as follows:
26	2-1-301. Goals of the Freedom-to-Farm Act.
27	The General Assembly:
28	(1) Recognizes the contributions that animal production by
29	hobbyists, commercial producers, and home food providers have made to this
30	<u>state;</u>
31	(2) Encourages animal production, since they are a major part of
32	the culture, customs, and economy of this state;
33	(3) Recognizes that protecting the right of production and sale
34	of animals is integral to ensuring the economic growth and general welfare of
35	this state;
36	(4) Recognizes that economic concerns and excessive regulation

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1	have caused many Arkansas families to abandon the production of animals; and
2	(5) Desires, through the Freedom-to-Farm Act, to encourage and
3	protect home food production, direct farm-to-consumer sales, hobby
4	production, off-farm commercial sales, and businesses that serve animal
5	producers.

7	2-1-302. Definitions.
8	(1) "Animal" means any living creature except a human or an
9	insect other than a honeybee;
10	(2) "Electronic identification device" means any insertable or
11	attachable apparatus that can emit frequencies that can be read by a
12	frequency reader or scanner;
13	<u>(3) "Premise" means a location at which an animal is grown,</u>
14	held, or sold.
15	
16	2-1-303. Exemption from registration and permitting.
17	<u>Unless a law or rule to the contrary was in effect before January 1,</u>
18	2007, for an animal producer to participate <i>in any activity on or off the</i>
19	<u>animal producers' premise, including without limitation the transfer of</u>
20	property, a state, county, or city agency shall not require that the animal
21	producer:
22	(1) Register the animal producers' premise;
23	<u>(2) Have a premises identification; or</u>
24	(3) Use electronic identification devices on or in animals.

26	<u>2-1-304. Voluntary compliance.</u>
27	Nothing in this subchapter shall prohibit or restrict an animal
28	producer from voluntarily complying with a program conducted by a public
29	agency that may require premise registration, animal identification, or both.
