19	a safe alternative living arrangement until the child can return home;

23	is the paramount concern in all foster care placements; and
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25	WHEREAS, allegations have been reported in the state-wide and
26	local newspapers of abuse to foster children; and
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28	WHEREAS, the state has a duty to respond swiftly and
29	appropriately to allegations of any mistreatment of children in foster
30	care; and
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32	WHEREAS, there is a need for an interim study to evaluate the
33	overall effectiveness of the ability of the Division of Children and
34	Family Services of the Department of Human Services to protect children
35	in the foster care system; and
