

1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-194
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3 REQUESTING THE HOUSE AGING, CHILDREN AND YOUTH, LEGISLATIVE AND
4 MILITARY AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE STUDY
5 THE OVERALL EFFECTIVENESS OF THE ADOPTION PROCEDURES UTILIZED BY
6 THE DIVISION OF CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
7 HUMAN SERVICES FOR CHILDREN IN ITS CUSTODY COMPARED TO PROCEDURES
8 UTILIZED BY PRIVATE ADOPTION AGENCIES.

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10 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the state to provide a strong
11 adoption system to fulfill permanency needs of our most vulnerable children;
12 and

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14 WHEREAS, there are approximately four thousand five hundred (4,500)
15 children currently in the state's foster care system; and

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17 WHEREAS, while the foster care system provides a temporary placement
18 for a child in a safe alternative living arrangement; and

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20 WHEREAS, adoption provides a permanent and stable living setting for a
21 child; and

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23 WHEREAS, many potential adoptive parents are forgoing the opportunity
24 to adopt children in Department of Human Services custody due to cumbersome
25 agency regulations, Department of Human Services staff shortages, and the
26 availability of the option for a private adoption; and

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28 WHEREAS, there is a need for an interim study to evaluate the overall
29 effectiveness of the ability of the Division of Children and Family Services
30 of the Department of Human Services to provide an efficient adoption system
31 for children in the Department of Human Services custody,

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33 NOW THEREFORE,

34 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON AGING, CHILDREN, AND YOUTH,
35 LEGISLATIVE AND MILITARY AFFAIRS AND THE SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN
36 AND YOUTH OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH ARKANSAS GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

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2 THAT the House Interim Committee on Aging, Children, and Youth,
3 Legislative and Military Affairs and the Senate Interim Committee on Children
4 and Youth:

5 (1) Study current laws and regulations governing adoption in the
6 state;

7 (2) Compare requirements for selecting and evaluating adoptive parents
8 in Department of Human Services adoption cases and private adoption cases;

9 (3) Review information and hear testimony from the Department of Human
10 Services, Division of Children and Family Services, private adoption
11 agencies, and other interested parties; and

12 (4) Make recommendations for changes in the laws, rules, and
13 procedures designed to create a more efficient adoptive system for children
14 in Department of Human Services custody to the Eighty-Seventh Arkansas
15 General Assembly.
