

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-202

REQUESTING THE HOUSE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND LABOR STUDY REGIONAL DISPARITY IN THE SALARIES OF ARKANSAS STATE EMPLOYEES.

WHEREAS, Arkansas state employees serve valuable roles in every part of the State of Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the General Assembly to ensure that state employees receive fair compensation for their work, regardless of their location in the state; and

WHEREAS, all state employees would be well-served by a study to determine if regional disparity exists regarding the salaries of state employees in various parts of the state; and

WHEREAS, this study is particularly pertinent for salaries of persons employed in juvenile services governed by the Division of Youth Services of the Department of Human Services and state contracts for social services, including without limitation day care for children of impoverished families; and

WHEREAS, such a study would provide confidence that employees throughout the state who perform the same job are receiving equitable compensation,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND
LABOR OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the House Interim Committee On Public Health, Welfare and Labor undertake a study to ascertain whether any disparity exists between state employee salaries in various parts of the State of Arkansas.
