

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-219

REQUESTING THE SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON STATE AGENCIES AND GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS TO STUDY THE ETHICS LAWS OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS.

WHEREAS, provisions of Arkansas law that deal with the ethics of elected officials, such as campaign finance laws and restrictions on certain activities, serve as a valuable safeguard to prevent corruption or undue influence of elected officials; and

WHEREAS, in recent years, Arkansas and various other states have considered legislation to strengthen their ethics laws; and

WHEREAS, before enacting any amendments to Arkansas's ethics laws, it is important to ensure that current ethics laws function as intended and to identify any weaknesses in current laws; and

WHEREAS, it is also important to ensure that any additions to the ethics laws of this state would benefit the public interest without imposing an unconstitutional burden,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON STATE AGENCIES AND GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the Senate Interim Committee On State Agencies And Governmental Affairs study the current ethics laws of the State of Arkansas to identify any areas in need of revision and consider whether proposed revisions would satisfy constitutional standards.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee request the assistance of the Attorney General of the State of Arkansas or his designee in conducting the review.
