

## INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-220

REQUESTING THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFER TO THE SENATE  
INTERIM COMMITTEE ON STATE AGENCIES AND GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS A  
STUDY ON THE POSSIBILITY OF ALLOWING STATE EMPLOYEES WHO TRAVEL  
LONG DISTANCES TO THEIR PLACE OF WORK TO SCHEDULE A FOUR-DAY WORK  
WEEK.

WHEREAS, state employees play a vital role in providing critical services to citizens of Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, rising gas costs have an impact on state employees, particularly those who travel long distances to their places of work; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of both state employees and citizens of the state to study ways to reduce this burden in a manner that allows the state to retain employees most affected by the increased costs of travel; and

WHEREAS, one possible means of achieving this goal is to allow state employees who live certain distances from their places of work to schedule a four-day work week; and

WHEREAS, this concept merits closer study to determine if it would allow state agencies to maintain their high levels of performance for the citizens of the state of Arkansas while providing relief to those employees most challenged by rising travel costs,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH  
GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council refer to the Senate Interim Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs a study on the possibility of allowing state employees who travel long distances to their place of work to schedule a four-day work week.
