

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-236

REQUESTING THAT THE CHARITABLE, PENAL, AND CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS SUBCOMMITTEE OF THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY THE POSSIBLE PRIVATIZATION OF CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES IN THE STATE OF ARKANSAS.

WHEREAS, correctional facilities in the state of Arkansas face both financial and logistical challenges as they strive to serve the state's inmate population; and

WHEREAS, the state should consider all options that might improve the state's correctional operations; and

WHEREAS, among the options that merit closer study is the possible privatization of state or local correctional facilities; and

WHEREAS, the possible advantages of privatization include the cost-effective provision of correctional needs, implementation of new ideas and management techniques, the use of new programs to reduce recidivism, and the alleviation of facility overcrowding; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Legislative Council should study this issue in advance of the upcoming legislative session to determine if correctional facility privatization would be a benefit to correctional services,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH
GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS,

THAT the Charitable, Penal, and Correctional Institutions Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative Council study the possible privatization of correctional facilities in the state of Arkansas.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the subcommittee invite a member of the Sheriff's Association, a member of the Arkansas Association of Chiefs of

1 Police, a member of the Board of Corrections, a county judge, a
2 representative of the Attorney General's Office, and a prosecuting attorney
3 to participate as nonvoting members of the study.
