

## INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-238

REQUESTING THE HOUSE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND LABOR AND THE SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND LABOR STUDY THE EFFECTS OF REMOVING THE COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT REQUIREMENT FOR ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSES.

WHEREAS, under current Arkansas law, an advanced practice nurse may be granted a certificate of prescriptive authority only if the nurse has a collaborative practice agreement with an Arkansas physician who has a practice comparable in scope, specialty, or expertise to that of the advanced practice nurse; and

WHEREAS, the requirement for collaborative agreements may limit the availability of advanced practice nurses in the state, particularly in medically underserved areas; and

WHEREAS, 14 states (Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Iowa, Maine, Montana, New Hampshire, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming, and Vermont) and the District of Columbia authorize advanced practice nurses to practice without a collaborative agreement; and

WHEREAS, Arkansas has consistently ranked among the least healthy states in the nation; and

WHEREAS, many Arkansans who cannot find or afford primary care from a physician must seek their primary health care through hospital emergency rooms, a method which is both more expensive and less efficient than office visits; and

WHEREAS, expanded opportunities for primary health care by advanced practice nurses could reduce the costs of health care and increase preventative care opportunities while maintaining the safety and efficacy of health care in this state,

NOW THEREFORE,

1 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND  
2 LABOR OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
