

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2007-239

REQUESTING THE HOUSE AND SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC
HEALTH, WELFARE AND LABOR TO STUDY STROKE WITH A PARTICULAR FOCUS
ON THE CONTRIBUTING RISK FACTOR OF HYPERTENSION.

WHEREAS, the effects of stroke on the health of Arkansas's citizens are sadly misunderstood; and

WHEREAS, every year over one thousand eight hundred (1,800) Arkansas citizens die from strokes, while many more suffer a stroke; and

WHEREAS, Arkansas is one of the unhealthiest states in the nation and this is particularly true when it comes to factors known to contribute to cardiovascular disease and stroke. Stroke accounts for nearly eight percent (8%) of all deaths in the state according to the latest statistics from 2003; and

WHEREAS, in Arkansas the prevalence of stroke is overwhelming. In 2006 there were over eight thousand four hundred (8,400) stroke-related hospitalizations in our state with a staggering total hospital cost of one hundred seventy-one million dollars (\$171,000,000). Today some sixty-three thousand (63,000) Arkansas citizens are currently living with the effects of a stroke; and

WHEREAS, nationally, some six hundred thousand (600,000) Americans will suffer a stroke and one hundred sixty thousand (160,000) will die within the following twelve (12) months, making stroke the third leading cause of death in our nation. Beyond the human toll, the economic impact is huge, with direct and indirect costs totaling over fifty billion dollars (\$50,000,000,000) annually; and

WHEREAS, Arkansas has the third highest mortality rate for stroke in the nation. While this ranking indicates that Arkansas has improved from previously having the highest stroke mortality rate in the nation, Arkansans still have a huge task before them; and

2 WHEREAS, hypertension is a major risk factor for stroke and the state
3 of Arkansas has a high percentage of individuals with this risk factor.
4 Therefore, conducting an interim study on stroke with a particular focus on
5 the contributing risk factor of hypertension is imperative for the state of
6 Arkansas,

8 NOW THEREFORE,

9 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND
10 LABOR OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

12 THAT the House Interim Committee On Public Health, Welfare And Labor
13 and the Senate Interim Committee On Public Health, Welfare And Labor study
14 stroke with a particular focus on the contributing risk factor of
15 hypertension.
