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23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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25 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 16, Subchapter 1 is amended
26 to add an additional section to read as follows:

27 20-16-102. Maternity patient informed consent.

28 (a)(1)(A) A maternity patient at the time of preadmission at a
29 hospital or birthing center shall be provided printed information related to
30 the types of birthing methods and their associated risks including vaginal
31 delivery and cesarean section deliveries.

32 (B) The information also shall be made available to the
33 general public upon request.

34 (2) The information shall include without limitation:

35 (A) The annual rate of cesarean sections, primary cesarean
36 sections, repeat cesarean sections, and total number of cesarean sections



performed at the hospital or birthing center;

(B) The annual percentage of women with previous cesarean sections who have had a subsequent successful vaginal birth;

(C) The annual percentage of deliveries by certified nurse-midwives;

(D) The annual percentage of births utilizing electronic fetal monitoring listed on the basis of external and internal;

(E) The annual percentage of births using forceps, listed on the basis of low forceps delivery and mid forceps delivery;

(F) The annual percentage of breech births delivered vaginally;

(G) The annual percentage of births using analgesia;

(H) The annual percentage of births using anaesthesia

including general, spinal, epidural, and paracervical listed on the basis of vaginal and cesarean births;

(I) The annual percentage of births using induction of labor;

(J) The annual percentage of births using augmentation of labor;

(K) The annual percentage of vaginal births using episiotomies;

(L) Whether birthing rooms are available for use in the hospital or birthing center;

(M) Whether rooming-in is available in the hospital or birthing center, on the basis of twenty-four (24) hours a day or daytime; and

(N) The annual percentage of women breastfeeding upon

(3) When available and applicable, the hospital or birthing center shall provide its statistics under subdivision (a)(2) of this section, as well as the statewide statistics.

(b) The Director of the Department of Health shall compile statewide statistics listed in subdivision (a)(2) from hospitals and birthing centers and include these statistics on its website.
