

1                   INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2009-181

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3   REQUESTING THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO DIRECT THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON  
4   EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE ARKANSAS SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF AND THE  
5   ARKANSAS SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND, INCLUDING THE SCHOOLS' STUDENTS, ACADEMIC  
6   POLICIES, FUNDING, AND OTHER IMPORTANT MATTERS.

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8       WHEREAS, the Arkansas School for the Deaf and the Arkansas School for  
9   the Blind have a long history in the state; and

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11      WHEREAS, the Arkansas School for the Deaf and the Arkansas School for  
12   the Blind play vital roles in the education of Arkansas citizens; and

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14      WHEREAS, a formal study of practices and policies is needed to ensure  
15   that the Arkansas School for the Deaf and the Arkansas School for the Blind  
16   are capable of maintaining the success they have historically achieved; and

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18      WHEREAS, it would be beneficial for the state to utilize the  
19   information gathered during the study in making future decisions that assist  
20   the Arkansas School for the Deaf and the Arkansas School for the Blind,

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22   NOW THEREFORE,

23   BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH  
24   GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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26      THAT the House Committee on Education, with the assistance of the  
27   Arkansas School for the Deaf, the Arkansas School for the Blind, and the  
28   Department of Education conduct a study of the Arkansas School for the Deaf  
29   and the Arkansas School for the Blind, including the schools' students,  
30   academic policies, funding, and other important matters.

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32      BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED, that the House Committee on Education study  
33   include, at a minimum:

- 34          (a) Student demographic data;
- 35          (b) Student achievement rates, including the rigor of curriculum;
- 36          (c) Discipline policies;

1           (d) Facility conditions;  
2           (e) Overall financial conditions;  
3           (f) Governance policies; and  
4           (g) Staffing.
