24	(a)(l) Parents or guardians desiring to provide a home school for
25	their children must give written notice to the superintendent of their local
26	school district of their intent to provide a home school for their children,
27	and sign a waiver acknowledging that the State of Arkansas is not liable for
28	the education of their children during the time that the parents choose to
29	home school, and, beginning July 1, 2010, provide a copy of proof of the most
30	recent state-mandated achievement test:
31	(A) At the beginning No later than August 15 immediately
32	preceding the beginning of each the school year but no later than August 15 ;

34	(B) By December 15 <u>December 1</u> for parents who decide to
35	start home schooling at the beginning of the spring semester ; or
