

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2009-189

REQUESTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY TO STUDY THE BARRIERS FATHERS FACE WHEN SEEKING JOINT PHYSICAL CUSTODY OF THEIR CHILDREN IN DIVORCE AND CHILD CUSTODY PROCEEDINGS.

WHEREAS, today it is common for both the mother and father of children to work outside of the home and for parental duties to be equally divided between mothers and fathers; and

WHEREAS, joint physical custody is an option in divorce and child custody proceedings that recognizes this reality and increases contact between children and their fathers, making the children's lives more similar to the lives they had before their parents divorced; and

WHEREAS, however, it has been reported that during divorce and child custody proceedings, courts are not awarding joint physical custody of children to the parents if the parents cannot agree to this arrangement; and

WHEREAS, a parent who is likely to obtain sole physical custody of his or her children may not agree to joint physical custody of his or her children for financial reasons, namely to ensure an award of child support; and

WHEREAS, the reasons often given for the decision to not award joint physical custody of the children to both parents when there is not an agreement between the parents is so the court avoids having to resolve disputes between parents because the parents will not cooperate with each other and the court prevents the use of its resources to resolve the parents' anticipated disputes; and

WHEREAS, these decisions by courts create insurmountable barriers for fathers who want to take a more active and participating role in their children's lives and who are denied the opportunity to establish that they

1 can cooperate with their ex-spouses in regards to child-rearing issues,
