

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2009-190

REQUESTING THAT THE ADMINISTRATIVE RULES AND REGULATIONS
SUBCOMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY THE IMPLEMENTATION
OF ACT 971 OF 2009.

WHEREAS, Act 971 of 2009 requires the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in collaboration with state-supported institutions of higher education, to develop by institution uniform measurable exit standards for remedial courses that are comparable to the ACT or SAT equivalent required for college-level enrollment in credit courses; and

WHEREAS, the uniform measurable exit standards are to be implemented no later than the fall semester of 2010; and

WHEREAS, since the passage of Act 971 there has been confusion on the "collaboration" envisioned by Act 971; and

WHEREAS, there has likewise been confusion over whether the revisions envisioned by Act 971 must be implemented by administrative rule; and

WHEREAS, verifying the legislative intent behind Act 971 and clarifying the means of implementing the act are critical factors in the development of the uniform measurable exit standards,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the Administrative Rules And Regulations Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative Council study the implementation of Act 971 of 2009, including without limitation a review of whether the uniform measurable exit standards should be implemented by administrative rule and an analysis of the legislative intent behind requiring collaboration between the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board and state-supported institutions of higher education.
