

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2009-243

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFER TO THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE THIS REQUEST TO STUDY THE EFFECT A MISDEMEANOR ON A PERSON'S CRIMINAL HISTORY HAS ON HIS OR HER POTENTIAL EMPLOYMENT OR LICENSING BY THE STATE.

WHEREAS, in many instances a person may have a misdemeanor on his or her criminal history; and

WHEREAS, there are many professions or vocations that require licensure by the State; and

WHEREAS, the presence of that misdemeanor might lead a state licensing board to refuse to license that person, per either state law or pursuant to the agency's own rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, a misdemeanor is not a felony, which is a much more serious classification of a crime, but is instead a low-level crime usually reserved for relatively minor transgressions; and

WHEREAS, as the result of having a misdemeanor on a person's criminal history, a person can be severely inhibited in his or her ability to find gainful employment in his or her chosen profession or vocation,

NOW THEREFORE.

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH
GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the Legislative Council refer to the House Committee on Judiciary this request to study the effects on a person's employment and licensure possibilities if he or she has a misdemeanor on his or her criminal history and that the Committee study potential legislative solutions to addressing this hurdle to a person's ability to find gainful employment;

THAT the House Committee on Judiciary invite all state agencies that

1 issue professional or vocational licenses to inform the Committee on their
2 respective policies on disqualifying misdemeanors, including yearly data on
3 how many licenses are issued and how many license applications are denied due
4 to the presence of a disqualifying misdemeanor; and

6 THAT the House Committee on Judiciary invite the Administrative Office
7 of the Courts to inform the Committee as to any data the agency possesses as
8 to how many misdemeanor convictions each county or judicial district records
9 yearly.
