15	against common preventable diseases; and

17	WHEREAS, Arkansas citizens in rural areas of the state often lack
18	access to primary care screenings and other services; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, access to primary preventative care services and other
21	services can reduce the number of Arkansans with chronic diseases; and

23	WHEREAS, pharmacists are trained to provide immunizations and other
24	primary care services; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, pharmacists are the most accessible healthcare professionals
27	and are located in rural communities throughout Arkansas,
28	
29	NOW THEREFORE,
30	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE INTERIM SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND
31	LABOR OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

33	THAT the Senate and House Interim Committees on Public Health, Welfare,
34	and Labor study increasing Arkansans' access to immunizations and other
35	medications by removing the age limit restrictions for pharmacists to
36	administer medications.
