16	TO PROVIDE NOTICE OF LAND SURVEYS TO
17	ADJOINING LANDOWNERS AND TO PROVIDE
18	PENALTIES FOR THE FAILURE TO GIVE NOTICE.
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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 48, Subchapter 3 is amended
24	to read as follows:
25	17-48-301. Purpose.
26	<u>(a)</u> The purpose of this subchapter is to <u>:</u>
27	<u>(1)(A)</u> enable surveyors Enable a surveyor to have access to
28	survey monuments, triangulation stations, traverse stations, leveling
29	stations, section corners, quarter-section corners and sixteenth-section
30	corners, locations, and other evidence needed in conducting or preparing for
31	surveys or in preserving such monuments, triangulation stations, traverse
32	stations, leveling stations, section corners, quarter-section corners and
33	sixteenth-section corners, locations, or other evidence.
34	(B) It is particularly recognized that at times it is
35	necessary for a surveyor to tread on property not in his or her survey
36	contract because the boundaries and corners of any parcel of land are

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1	necessarily also those of adjoining parcels and because the location of
2	boundaries and corners often are affected by the location of some that are
3	remote and not adjoining; and
4	(2)(A) Provide adjoining landowners the simplest form of advance
5	notice of a survey and an opportunity to provide the surveyor relevant
6	information concerning the survey, including without limitation information
7	concerning the location of monuments, landmarks, and boundary lines.
8	(B) It is particularly recognized that adjoining
9	landowners may be:
10	(i) A valuable source of specific and historic
11	information in conducting a survey; and
12	(ii) Damaged or otherwise negatively impacted by an
13	inaccurate survey that could have been avoided if the landowner was given
14	notice and an opportunity to consult the surveyor before the land survey.
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16	17-48-302. Definition Definitions.
17	As used in this subchapter ,
18	(1) "Adjoining landowner" means the owner of real property that
19	borders the real property being surveyed; and
20	(2) "surveyor" "Surveyor" means a person:
21	(1)(A) Who is a registered surveyor licensed to practice
22	in the State of Arkansas by permanent registration number or by special
23	permit;
24	(2)(B) Employed in surveying by the United States
25	Government, by the State of Arkansas, or by a local government agency; and
26	(3)(C) Who is under the direct supervision of or is
27	employed by a person who is a surveyor under subdivision (1) or (2) (2)(A) or
28	(2)(B) of this section.
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30	17-48-303. <u>Notice –</u> Right to enter – Immunity from arrest –
31	Identification.
32	(a) Surveyors <u>A surveyor</u> shall <u>:</u>
33	(1)(A) Five (5) days before conducting a survey notify each
34	adjoining landowner by personal delivery or posting on the front door of the
35	adjoining landowner's residence that a survey of adjacent property will be

1	conducted on or after a date no earlier than twenty (20) days from the date
2	of the notice.
3	(B) The notice shall include:
4	(i) A description and street address of the property
5	to be surveyed; and
6	(ii) The name of the surveyor, and an address and
7	phone number where the surveyor or a representative of the surveyor can be
8	reached to discuss the survey during regular business hours; and
9	(2) After complying with subdivision (a)(1) of this section,
10	$rac{\mathrm{have}}{\mathrm{has}}$ the right to enter on public or private land or waters, except
11	buildings, in the lawful pursuit of their occupations surveying and shall be
12	immune from arrest for trespass when performing their the duties as
13	prescribed in <u>by</u> this subchapter.
14	(b)(1) Where practical, surveyors <u>a surveyor</u> shall announce and
15	identify themselves the surveyor's identity and their intentions before
16	entering upon private property.
17	(2) Surveyors will <u>A</u> surveyor shall:
18	(A) carry means of Carry proper identification as to their
19	of the surveyor's registration or and employment; and
20	<u>(B)</u> will display Display the identification to anyone
21	requesting it upon request by any person.
22	(3) Surveyors <u>A surveyor</u> shall not use the privilege granted
23	herein in this subchapter to extend that \underline{a} point of entry as determined by
24	actual survey requirements.
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26	17-48-304. Liability.
27	(a) Surveyors <u>A surveyor</u> shall be personally liable for any damage
28	caused to <u>:</u>
29	(1) private Private property when exercising entry under this
30	subchapter; and
31	(2) An adjoining landowner who was prevented by the actions of
32	the surveyor from exercising the adjoining landowner's rights under this
33	subchapter.
34	(b) Surveyors <u>A surveyor</u> shall forfeit any and all claim <u>claims</u> for
35	damage or personal injury against the landowner while on such the landowner's

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lands or waters unless the damage or injury is caused by the intentional
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     tortious conduct of the landowner or his or her the landowner's agent.
