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28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-4-1002 is amended to read as follows:

31	(a) The Except as provided in this chapter, the right of a person to
32	an annuity, $to$ the return of accumulated contributions, the annuity itself,

If a *public employee* has pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to or been found 16 17 guilty of theft of property against the employer under § 5-36-103, then the portion of the annuity based on employer contributions shall be recalculated 18 19 to exclude the months in which the theft of property against the employer occurred beginning with thefts occurring on or after July 1, 2011. 20 21 22 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-6-223 is amended to read as follows: 23 24-6-223. Interest in fund not transferable or subject to legal process -- Loss of right to benefits. 24 25 (a) No person entitled to any interest or share in any pension, any 26 return of contributions or accumulated contributions, or any other benefit 27 payable or to be made payable from funds of the system shall have the right to anticipate such entitlement or to sell, assign, pledge, mortgage, or 28 29 otherwise dispose of or encumber such entitlement, nor shall any interest or 30 share in any pension, any return of contributions or accumulated 31 contributions, or any other benefit payable or to be made payable from funds 32 of the system be liable for the debts or liabilities of the person or persons entitled thereto, or be subject to attachment, garnishment, execution, levy, 33 34 sale, or judicial proceedings, or be transferable by any means, voluntarily or involuntarily, except as expressly provided for in this subchapter. 35 36 (b) Should a member be If a member is covered by a group insurance or

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1 prepayment plan participated in by the Department of Arkansas State Police 2 and should he be if he or she is permitted to, and elect to and elects to, 3 continue the coverage as a retirant, nothing contained in this section shall 4 does not prevent the board, upon the member's written request, from deducting 5 from his or her pension the payments required of him or her to continue 6 coverage under the group insurance or prepayment plan. 7 (c) The State of Arkansas shall have has the right of setoff for any 8 claim arising from embezzlement by, or fraud of, a member, retirant, or 9 beneficiary.

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(a)(1) The right of a person to an annuity, to the return of
 accumulated contributions, to the annuity itself, to any annuity option, and
 to any other right accrued or accruing under the provisions of the this act,
 and all moneys belonging to the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, shall not
 be subject to execution, garnishment, attachment, the operation of bankruptcy
 or insolvency laws, or any other process of law whatsoever and shall be
 unassignable, except as is specifically provided in this act.

8 (2) However, the employer shall have <u>has</u> the right of setoff for 9 any claim arising from embezzlement by, or fraud of, a member, retirant, or 10 beneficiary.

11 (b) In the event If an individual is no longer an active teacher or 12 employee of any public school district in this state, nor or on leave of absence, and is found by any court of competent jurisdiction of this state to 13 14 be willfully refusing or failing to support minor dependent children of the 15 individual in violation of a court order providing for such support, although the individual is financially able to do so, then the court may, in its 16 17 discretion, order the accumulated contributions, annuity or annuity options, 18 or any other funds accruing under the provisions of this act to be paid into 19 the registry of the court for such further disposition as the court shall 20 deem deems just and proper.

(c)(1) If, under the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, there is created a court order which that directs payment of all, or a portion of, a person's accumulated contributions, the payment shall be made by the system to the court.

(2) The person shall be notified by the system of the payment
and shall be given an opportunity to redeposit with the system the amount of
the payment.

(3) If the payment is not redeposited, then any system annuity
otherwise payable to, or on behalf of, the person shall be reduced in the
proportion that the payment bears to the person's accumulated contributions
before the payment.

EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 21 22 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that employees convicted of theft 23 of property against the employer are currently eligible to draw retirement 24 benefits from the employer; that these members should not be allowed to profit from their crimes; and that for the months in which the thefts 25 26 occurred,.
