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26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 25, Subchapter 3 is amended
29	to add a new section to read as follows:
30	17-25-317. Workers without legal authorization to work in the United
31	<u>States — Prohibition.</u>
32	(a) As used in this section, "worker without legal authorization to
33	work in the United States" means an individual who cannot present valid and
34	appropriate documentation evidencing both identity and authorization to work
35	as required by Federal Form 1-9 as existing on January 1, 2011, and using the

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1	applicable regulations, standards, and guidelines of Federal Form 1-9 as
2	existing on January 1, 2011.
3	(b)(1) If after notice and hearing, a contractor licensed under this
4	chapter is found by the Contractors Licensing Board to knowingly employ a
5	worker without legal authorization to work in the United States either
6	directly or through a subcontractor, the board may:
7	(A) Suspend the contractor's certificate of license; or
8	(B) Revoke the contractor's certificate of license.
9	(2) A contractor shall not be found to have knowingly employed a
10	worker without legal authorization to work in the United States if the
11	contractor uses the federal E-verify system, if allowed by law, to verify the
12	legal status of all persons offered employment by the contractor. Use of the
13	federal E-verify system, if allowed by law, is an affirmative defense under
14	this section.
15	(c) A contractor shall not be liable through a subcontractor under
16	this section if the contractor and subcontractor agree in writing that the
17	subcontractor shall be responsible for verifying through the federal E-verify
18	system, if allowed by law, that each worker employed by the subcontractor is
19	legally authorized to work in the United States.
20	(d) The board shall promulgate rules necessary to carry out the
21	provisions of this section.
