16	IN WORKERS' COMPENSATION CASES.
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 11-9-715(a), concerning attorney's fees in
22	workers' compensation cases, is amended to read as follows:
23	(a)(l)(A) Fees for legal services rendered in respect of <u>to pursue</u> a
24	claim shall not be valid unless approved by the Workers' Compensation
25	Commission.
26	(B) Attorney's fees shall be twenty-five percent (25%) of
27	compensation for indemnity benefits payable to the injured employee or
28	dependents of a deceased employee. Attorney's fees shall not be awarded on
29	medical benefits or services except as provided in subdivision (a)(4) of this
30	section.
31	(2)(A) <u>(i)</u> Whenever <u>If</u> the commission finds that <u>all or part of</u> a
32	claim against the Treasurer of State, as custodian of the Second Injury Trust
33	Fund or as custodian of the Death and Permanent Total Disability Trust Fund,
34	has been controverted, in whole or in part, the commission shall direct that
35	fees for legal services be paid from the fund, in addition to compensation
36	awarded ,

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1 (ii) and the The fees shall be allowed only on the 2 amount of compensation controverted and awarded from the fund. 3 (B)(i) In all other cases whenever if the commission finds 4 that all or part of a claim has been controverted, in whole or in part, the 5 commission shall direct that fees for legal services be paid to the attorney 6 for the claimant as follows: 7 (a) One-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ by the employer or carrier in 8 addition to compensation awarded; and 9 (b) one-half One-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ by the injured 10 employee or dependents of a deceased employee out of compensation payable to them the injured employee or dependents of a deceased employee. 11 12 (ii) The fees shall be allowed only on the amount of 13 compensation for indemnity benefits controverted and awarded. 14 (iii) However, the commission shall not find that a 15 claim has been controverted if the claimant or his or her representative has 16 withheld from the respondent during the period of time allotted for the 17 respondent to determine its position any medical information in his or her 18 possession which that substantiates the claim. 19 (C)(i) Whenever If the commission finds that a claim has not been controverted but further finds that bona fide legal services have 20 21 been rendered in respect to pursue the claim, then the commission shall 22 direct the payment of the fees by the injured employee or dependents of a 23 deceased employee out of the compensation awarded. 24 (ii) In determining the amount of fees when a claim 25 is not controverted, the commission shall use its discretion in awarding an 26 attorney's fee not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) and in so doing shall 27 take into consideration the nature, length, and complexity of the services 28 performed and the benefits resulting to the compensation beneficiaries. 29 (3) In any case where attorney's fees are allowed by the 30 commission, the limitations expressed in the first sentence herein shall 31 apply. 32 (4) Medical providers may voluntarily contract with the attorney for the claimant to recover disputed bills, and the attorney may charge a 33 34 reasonable fee to the medical provider as a cost of collection. 35

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1	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 11-9-715, concerning attorney fee awards in
2	workers' compensation cases, is amended to add an additional subsection to
3	read as follows:
4	(f)(1) The commission also may award an attorney's fee of twenty
5	percent (20%) of the amounts payable for medical benefits awarded to the
6	injured employee or dependents of a deceased employee, not to exceed two
7	thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).
8	(2) The fee awarded under subdivision (f)(1) of this section
9	shall be paid solely by the employer or carrier.
