1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2011-179 2 REQUESTING THE INTERIM JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC RETIREMENT & 3 SOCIAL SECURITY PROGRAMS TO STUDY THE PREVALENCE OF PUBLIC 4 EMPLOYEES RETURNING TO WORK FOR THE STATE AFTER RETIRING AND THE 5 6 ECONOMIC, SOCIAL, AND OTHER EFFECTS OF PERMITTING PUBLIC 7 EMPLOYEES TO RECEIVE BENEFITS FROM THE ARKANSAS PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' 8 RETIREMENT SYSTEM WHILE BEING EMPLOYED BY THE STATE. 9 10 WHEREAS, public employees are permitted to return to employment with 11 the state after retiring under the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement 12 System; and 13 14 WHEREAS, employees who return to employment receive both their 15 retirement benefits and a salary from the state; and 16 17 WHEREAS, under Act 657 of 2009, members of the Arkansas Public 18 Employees' Retirement System are required to wait at least one hundred eighty 19 (180) days after retiring before returning to work for the state; and 20 21 WHEREAS, under Act 657 of 2009, certain members of the Arkansas Public 22 Employees' Retirement System are entitled to have the termination-period 23 requirement waived and may return to employment with the state thirty (30) 24 days after commencing retirement, 25 26 NOW THEREFORE, 27 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE INTERIM JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC RETIREMENT & SOCIAL SECURITY PROGRAMS OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF 28 29 ARKANSAS: 30 31 THAT the Interim Joint Committee On Public Retirement & Social Security 32 Programs study the economical, social, and other effects of permitting public 33 employees to receive benefits from the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement 34 System while being employed by the state; 35 36 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the Interim Joint Committee On Public

Retirement & Social Security Programs study the number of state agency directors and grade-99 state employees that are receiving benefits from the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System and a salary from the state and the economic, social, and other effects of permitting this activity; BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the Interim Joint Committee On Public Retirement & Social Security Programs study the number of members of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System entitled to a waiver of the termination-period requirement under Act 657 of 2009 and the economic, social, and other effects of waivers under Act 657 of 2009; BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the Interim Joint Committee On Public Retirement & Social Security Programs study the number of public employees that have retired under the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System and returned to work for the state since Act 657 of 2009 was enacted and the economic, social, and other effects of permitting this activity; and BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the Interim Joint Committee On Public Retirement & Social Security Programs study the feasibility and effectiveness of legislation requiring state agencies to notify the legislature when an agency director or deputy director retires.
