18	PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A VOTER

22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23	
24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 7-1-101 is amended to read as follows:
25	7-1-101. Definitions.
26	As used in this title, unless the context or chapter otherwise
27	requires:
28	(1) "Administrator" means the administrative head of a long-term
29	care or residential care facility licensed by the state who is authorized in
30	writing by a patient of the long-term care or residential care facility to
31	deliver the application for an absentee ballot and to obtain or deliver the
32	absentee ballot to the county clerk;
33	(2) "Affidavit of eligibility" means an affidavit signed by a
34	candidate for elective office stating that the candidate is eligible to serve
2.5	in the office he or she sooks.

1 (3) "Audit log" means an electronically stored record of events 2 and ballot images from which election officials may produce a permanent paper 3 record with a manual audit capacity for a voting system using voting 4 machines;

- (4) "Authorized agent" means a person who is identified and authorized to deliver the application, obtain a ballot, and deliver the ballot on the day of the election to the county clerk for an applicant who is medically unable to cast a ballot at a polling site due to an unforeseen medical necessity as set forth in an affidavit from the administrator of a hospital or long-term care or residential care facility;
- 11 (5) "Canvassing" means examining and counting the returns of 12 votes cast at a public election to determine authenticity;
 - (6) "Certificate of choice" means a certificate, signed by an executive officer of a political group that submits a petition to place its candidates for President and Vice-President on the ballot, designating the names of its candidates to appear on the ballot;
- 17 (7) "Constitutional officers of this state" means the offices of 18 the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, 19 Auditor of State, Treasurer of State, and Commissioner of State Lands;
 - (8) "Counting location" means a location selected by the county board of election commissioners with respect to all elections for the automatic processing or counting, or both, of votes;
 - (9) "Designated bearer" means any person who is identified and authorized by the applicant to obtain from the county clerk or to deliver to the county clerk the applicant's ballot;
 - (10) "Election official" or "election officer" means a person who is a member of the county board of election commissioners or a person who is a poll worker designated by a county board of election commissioners to be an election clerk, election judge, or election sheriff;
 - (11) "Electronic vote tabulating device" means a device used to electronically scan a marked paper ballot for the purpose of tabulation;
 - (12) "Fail-safe voting" means the mechanism established under the National Voter Registration Act of 1993, 42 U.S.C. § 1973 et seq., that allows a voters voter who has moved within the same county to vote at his or her new precinct without having updated his or her voter registration records;

1 and documentation required to program, control, and support the equipment 2 that is used to: 3 (i) Define ballots: 4 (ii) Cast and count votes; 5 (iii) Report or display election results; and 6 (iv) Maintain and produce any audit trail 7 information; and 8 The practices and documentation used to: (B) 9 (i) Identify system components and versions of 10 components; 11 (ii) Test the system during its development and 12 maintenance; (iii) Maintain records of system errors and defects; 13 14 (iv) Determine specific system changes to be made to 15 a system after the initial qualification of the system; and 16 (v) Make available any materials to the voter, 17 including without limitation notices, instructions, forms, or paper ballots. 18 19 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-5-201 is amended to read as follows: 20 7-5-201. Voter qualification. 21 (a) To be qualified to vote, a person shall have registered at least 22 thirty (30) calendar days immediately prior to the election and in the manner 23 set forth by Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 51. 24 (b) "Voting residence" shall be a voter's domicile and shall be 25 governed by the following provisions: 26 (1) The domicile of a person is that place in which his or her 27 habitation is fixed to which he or she has the intention to return whenever 28 he or she is absent; 29 (2) A change of domicile is made only by the act of abandonment, 30 joined with the intent to remain in another place. A person can have only one 31 (1) domicile at any given time; 32 (3) A person does not lose his or her domicile if he or she 33 temporarily leaves his or her home and goes to another country, state, or 34 place in this state with the intent of returning;

- 1 (4) The place where a person's family resides is presumed to be 2 his or her place of domicile, but a person may acquire a separate residence if he or she takes another abode with the intention of remaining there; 3 4 (5) A married person may be considered to have a domicile 5 separate from that of his or her spouse for the purposes of voting or holding 6 office. For those purposes, domicile is determined as if the person were 7 single; and 8 (6) Persons who are temporarily living in a particular place 9 because of a temporary work-related assignment or duty post or as a result of 10 their performing duties in connection with their status as military personnel, students, or office holders shall be deemed residents of that 11 12 place where they established their home prior to beginning such assignments 13 or duties. 14 (c) No person may be qualified to vote in more than one (1) precinct 15 of any county at any one (1) time. (d)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (d)(2) and subsection (e) of 16 17 this section, any person desiring to vote in this state shall: 18 (A) Present proof of identity to the election official 19 when appearing to vote in person either early or at the polls on election 20 day; or (B) When voting by mail, submit with the ballot a copy of 21 22 a current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, 23 bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that 24 shows the name and address of the voter. 25 (2)(A) A person who is a resident of a licensed nursing home, licensed residential care facility, licensed assisted-living facility, or any 26 27 licensed facility that provides long-term medical or personal care is not required to provide proof of identity before voting. 28 29 (B) A person not required to provide proof of identity 30 under subdivision (d)(2)(A) of this section shall provide documentation from the administrator of the facility attesting that the person is a resident of 31 32 the facility. 33
 - (d)(e)(1) Any In addition to the proof of identity required by subdivision (d)(1) of this section, a person registering to vote by mail and who has not previously voted in a federal election in this state shall:

32	(a)(1)(A) The Secretary of State shall provide by rule for the
33	issuance of a voter identification card that may be requested by an
34	individual to be used as proof of identity when appearing to vote in person.
35	(R) The rules shall include without limitation.

1	(i) A requirement that the voter identification card
2	include a photograph of the voter;
3	(ii) Specification of the information to be included
4	on the voter identification card; and
5	(iii) Provisions concerning the expiration of a
6	voter identification card.

20	(a)(1)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (a)(1)(B) of this section,
21	early voting shall be available to any qualified elector who applies to the
22	county clerk's designated early voting location, beginning fifteen (15) days
23	before a preferential primary or general election between the hours of 8:00
24	a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
25	Saturday and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the Monday before the election.
26	(B) Early voting shall not be available on state or county
27	holidays.
28	(2) However, on all other elections, including the general
29	primary and general runoff elections, early voting shall be available to any
30	qualified elector who applies to the county clerk during regular office
31	hours, beginning seven (7) days before the election and ending on the day
32	before the election day at the time the county clerk's office regularly
33	closes.
34	(b)(1)(A) The county board of election commissioners may decide to
35	hold early voting at additional polling sites outside the offices of the

- 1 county clerk on any of the days and times provided for in subsection (a) of 2 this section, if it so chooses.
- 3 (B) The county board of election commissioners shall 4 determine by unanimous vote the location of additional polling sites for 5 early voting.

- (2) The county board of election commissioners shall appoint the election officials for the additional early voting polling site or sites in the same manner as election officials are appointed for election day.
- 9 (3)(A) The county board of election commissioners shall notify 10 the county clerk of its decision to hold early voting at additional polling 11 sites outside the office of the county clerk within ten (10) days of the 12 decision.
 - (B) If the county board of election commissioners decides to hold early voting at one (1) or more conveniently located polling sites on the days and times under subsection (a) of this section, the county clerk may choose not to hold early voting within the office of the county clerk. The county clerk shall notify the county board within ten (10) days of the receipt of notice from the county board of election commissioners regarding early voting at additional polling sites.
- 20 (4) The early voting election official shall record the date on 21 all pages of the early voting roster or early voting request form and keep a 22 daily record of the number of early ballots cast.
 - (5) All voted ballots and unvoted ballots and all related election materials at each additional early voting polling site shall be stored in a secure location in the county courthouse or in a secure location as determined by the county board of election commissioners immediately after the close of the additional polling sites each day that early voting is conducted there.
 - (c) Before a person is permitted to cast an early vote, the county clerk or election official shall:
- 31 (1) Request the voter to identify himself or herself by stating 32 his or her name, date of birth, and address in order to verify his or her 33 registration;
- 34 (2) Request the voter to present proof of identity to the county 35 clerk or election official;

1	$\frac{(2)}{(3)}$ If the voter's name or address is not the same as that in
2	the county voter registration record files, request the voter to complete an
3	updated voter registration application form;
4	$\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ Request the voter to sign an early voting roster or early
5	voting request form that identifies his or her name, address, date of birth,
6	and the date on the roster or form; and
7	(4)(5) Enter the voter's precinct number on the early voting
8	roster or early voting request form.
9	(d) $\underline{(1)}$ If the voter is not listed in the county voter registration
10	record files and the county clerk is unable to verify the voter's
11	registration and if the voter contends that he or she is eligible to vote,
12	then the voter may vote a provisional ballot that shall be counted only upon
13	verification of the voter's registration status.
14	(2)(A) If the voter fails to provide proof of identity, the
15	election official shall follow the procedure stated in § 7-5-321.
16	(B)(i) A person who is a resident of a licensed nursing
17	home, licensed residential care facility, licensed assisted-living facility,
18	or any licensed facility that provides long-term medical or personal care is
19	not required to provide proof of identity before voting.
20	(ii) A person not required to provide proof of
21	identity under subdivision (d)(2)(B)(i) of this section shall provide
22	documentation from the administrator of the facility attesting that the
23	person is a resident of the facility.
24	(e) The county clerk or county board shall furnish voting locations
25	that adequately allow the early voter to personally and secretly execute his
26	or her ballot.
27	(f) Except as provided in this section, early voting shall be
28	conducted in the same manner as voting on election day. Conduct that is
29	prohibited or restricted on election day shall be subject to the same
30	prohibitions and restrictions on the days on which early voting is conducted.

32	SECTION 6. NOT TO BE CODIFIED. This act shall become effective upon
33	the later of the following:
