1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2011-184 2 REQUESTING THAT THE INTERIM SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, 3 4 WELFARE, AND LABOR STUDY THE SAFETY OF SOCCER GOALS USED IN 5 CHILDREN'S SPORTS, INCLUDING HEARING TESTIMONY FROM EXPERTS AND 6 STAKEHOLDERS ON IMPROVING SOCCER GOAL SAFETY IN THE STATE. 7 8 WHEREAS, since its first year of inception in 1974, youth soccer in the 9 United States has grown to be the largest youth sports organization in the 10 United States, counting more than three million two hundred thousand 11 (3,200,000) members whose ages range from five (5) to nineteen (19) years; 12 and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Arkansas State Soccer Association is the governing body 15 for youth soccer in Arkansas, and the association currently includes fifty-16 eight (58) member associations with approximately twenty-six thousand 17 (26,000) members; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the Arkansas State Soccer Association is one of the largest 20 youth sports organizations in Arkansas, and it has experienced a one hundred 21 thirty-five percent (135%) increase in its membership over the past ten (10) 22 years; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Arkansas State Soccer Association is dedicated to 25 providing affordable opportunities for everyone to play soccer in a 26 structured environment by designing and implementing programs that allow 27 players to reach their full potential consistent with their ability and 28 commitment, while emphasizing sportsmanship, teamwork, positive values, 29 personal growth, and self-esteem; and 30 31 WHEREAS, approximately ninety (90) schools participated in the AAA High 32 School Soccer program in 2011; and 33 34 WHEREAS, in addition to programs affiliated with the Arkansas State 35 Soccer Association and school soccer programs, there are at least thirty (30)

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1 independent parks and recreation programs and at least sixty (60) other 2 independent programs; and 3 4 WHEREAS, soccer reaches every corner of the state of Arkansas, both 5 rural and urban, and is a life-long sport that has immediate benefits on the 6 players' health and overall wellness, exercise habits, emotional well-being, 7 and educational outcomes; and 8 9 WHEREAS, problems arise with instability of moveable soccer goals when 10 they are unanchored, not properly anchored, or not properly counterbalanced; 11 and 12 WHEREAS, unstable soccer goals pose an unnecessary risk of tipover to 13 14 children who climb on the goals or nets or hang from the crossbar and can 15 cause catastrophic injury to persons around the soccer goal; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the issue of soccer goal safety and the instability of moveable soccer goals was recently addressed by the Arkansas General Assembly 18 19 in the 2011 Regular Session; and 20 21 WHEREAS, Act 772 of 2011 was passed to address this issue by requiring 22 soccer goals in public recreation areas to be anchored according to the 23 Guidelines for Movable Soccer Goal Safety promulgated by the United States 24 Consumer Product Safety Commission or the guidelines adopted by the Arkansas 25 Department of Health, 26 27 NOW THEREFORE, 28 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE INTERIM SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE AND 29 LABOR OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 30 31 THAT the Interim Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor, 32 or a subcommittee of the committee, hear testimony, including expert 33 testimony, and study all available information on the safety of soccer goals 34 used in children's sports with the purpose of providing recommendations to 35 improve soccer goal safety in the State.

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     safety of soccer goals used in children's sports and on what other states are
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     doing to improve soccer goal safety.
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           BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that at the conclusion of the study the
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     committee make recommendations for improving soccer goal safety.
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           BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that this study be completed by January 15,
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     2012.
