INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2011-218

REQUESTING THAT THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFER TO THE
INTERIM HOUSE COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND ECONOMIC
DEVELOPMENT A STUDY CONCERNING THE PRACTICES OF CONSOLIDATED
WATERWORKS SYSTEMS IN EXTENDING SERVICES BEYOND THE TERRITORIES
OF THE INITIAL CONSOLIDATING WATERWORKS SYSTEMS AND THE POTENTIAL
NEED FOR ADDITIONAL LEGISLATION.

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10 WHEREAS, the quality of life for all Arkansans depends upon the 11 availability of a good and reliable supply of safe drinking water at a 12 reasonable price; and

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WHEREAS, municipalities, improvement districts, and water distribution districts are authorized by state law to provide water to their residents, are governed by boards that are representative of the customers, and are exempt from rate regulation by the Arkansas Public Service Commission; and 18

WHEREAS, in 2001 the General Assembly enacted Act 982 of 2001, which authorized two or more public agencies to enter into an interlocal agreement for the purpose of constructing, owning, managing, operating, financing, improving, extending, acquiring, reconstructing, equipping, selling, leasing, contracting concerning, dealing in, disposing of, and maintaining the consolidated waterworks system; and

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WHEREAS, consolidated waterworks systems have the authority to use assets initially contributed by the initial waterworks systems to expand services outside the service territory of the initial contributing waterworks systems under terms and conditions not necessarily contemplated when the consolidated waterworks system was initially established; and

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32 WHEREAS, consolidated waterworks systems have the authority to acquire 33 additional waterworks systems after the initial consolidation, thereby 34 expanding the service territory beyond that contemplated when the initial 35 consolidation was undertaken such that the fundamentals contemplated when the 36 initial interlocal agreement was negotiated may have materially changed; and

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1 2 WHEREAS, the representation of the waterworks systems that initially combined to form the consolidated waterworks on the board of the consolidated 3 4 waterworks and the manner in which board members are selected and replaced 5 may no longer be appropriate; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Act 982 of 2001 fails to provide a procedure whereby 8 waterworks systems that merge into or are otherwise acquired by a 9 consolidated waterworks system after its initial formation are provided 10 representation on the board of the consolidated waterworks; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the lack of representation of all wholesale and retail 13 customers of a consolidated waterworks system and the lack of public service 14 commission oversight present a potential for inequitable utilization and 15 allocation of assets, discrimination among classes of customers, and unfair 16 rate design by consolidated waterworks systems; and 17 18 WHEREAS, after ten years of operating under Act 982 of 2001, an 19 evaluation of the law is appropriate, 20 21 NOW THEREFORE, 22 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 23 24 25 THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council refer to the Interim House 26 Committee on Agriculture, Forestry and Economic Development a study of the 27 practices of consolidated waterworks systems in: 28 (a) Acting in the best interest of those waterworks systems that 29 contributed assets to the consolidated waterworks systems; 30 (b) Extending services beyond the territories of the initial 31 consolidating waterworks systems; 32 (c) Providing appropriate representation on the consolidated 33 waterworks system's board of directors; and 34 (d) Establishing fair and equitable rate design. 35 36 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the Interim House Committee on Agriculture,

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Forestry and Economic Development make recommendations to the General
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     Assembly regarding any additional legislation that may be necessary and
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     appropriate with respect to consolidated waterworks systems.
