1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2013-079 2 REQUESTING THAT THE INTERIM HOUSE COMMITTEE ON STATE AGENCIES AND 3 GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE MOST ECONOMICAL AND 4 EFFICIENT MEANS OF INTRASTATE TRAVEL FOR CONDUCTING STATE 5 6 BUSINESS. 7 8 WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas covers 53,183 square miles; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the intrastate travel of state employees is essential to the 11 performance of state government functions and duties; and 12 13 WHEREAS, employees of the State of Arkansas utilize state-owned 14 vehicles, employee-owned vehicles, and rental or leased vehicles to perform 15 their duties; and 16 17 WHEREAS, intrastate state travel is a large cost to state government; 18 and 19 20 WHEREAS, polices governing the appropriate manner of intrastate travel 21 to conduct state business could lead to possible economic savings for state 22 government, 23 24 NOW THEREFORE, 25 IT PROPOSED BY THE INTERIM HOUSE COMMITTEE ON STATE AGENCIES AND BE 26 GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF 27 ARKANSAS: 28 29 THAT the interim House Committee on State Agencies and Governmental 30 Affairs conduct a study regarding the most economical and efficient means of 31 intrastate travel for conducting state business, including without limitation 32 a discussion of concrete examples of state dollar savings which would occur 33 depending on the method of transportation used and consideration of the usage 34 of state-owned vehicles, employee-owned vehicles, and rental or leased 35 vehicles. 36

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     BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT the study review and provide recommendations
     concerning possible implementation of a policy for the utilization of
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     specific methods of transportation to be used to perform state government
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     functions and duties.
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     BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT the study be conducted with the assistance of the
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     Department of Finance and Administration, the Division of Legislative Audit,
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     and other state agencies upon request.
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     BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT on or before July 1, 2014, the study and its
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     recommendations be completed and a report be presented to the interim House
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     Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs with findings and
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     recommendations from the study.
