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25	SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Title.</u>
26	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas Education
27	Homestead Exemption Act".
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29	SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. Legislative findings.
30	The General Assembly finds that:
31	(1) The state currently spends thousands of dollars per child
32	educating school age children;
33	(2) Most parents who choose an alternative education program for
34	their child, including private schooling or home schooling, are not only
35	paying to support the public schools through property tax and other state
36	taxes, but they also have to pay for their child's private school tuition or

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1	home school materials; and
2	(3) The state would have more money available per student for
3	public schools if more parents and guardians paid for their own children's
4	education programs.
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6	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 26-26-1118(a)(1), concerning the limitation
7	on the increase of a property's assessed value, is amended to read as
8	follows:
9	(a)(l)(A) There is established a homestead property tax credit for
10	each assessment year that reduces the amount of real property taxes assessed
11	on the homestead of each property owner by three hundred fifty dollars
12	(\$350).
13	(B) A taxpayer who is eligible for a homestead property
14	tax credit under subdivision (a)(l)(A) of this section shall receive an
15	additional homestead property tax credit in the amount of one hundred dollars
16	(\$100) for each child:
17	(i) For whom the taxpayer is the parent or guardian;
18	(ii) Who is at least five (5) years of age but not
19	more than seventeen (17) years of age; and
20	(iii) Who is either:
21	(a) Enrolled in a private school; or
22	(b) Attending a home school as defined in § 6-
23	<u>15-501.</u>
24	(B) (C) However, an assessment shall not be reduced to
25	less than zero dollars (\$0.00).
