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           REQUESTING THAT THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFER TO THE
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           HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND LABOR THIS
           PROPOSAL TO STUDY IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ADULT EMPLOYEES.
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           WHEREAS, Arkansas law imposes immunization or vaccine requirements on
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     students and children; and
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           WHEREAS, the existing immunization requirements allow an exemption for
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     students and children who have medical reasons, religious beliefs, or
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     philosophical beliefs that conflict with immunization; and
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           WHEREAS, the Nursing Home Resident and Employee Immunization Act of
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     1999, § 20-10-1301 et seq., requires both residents of nursing home
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     facilities and employees of nursing home facilities to undergo influenza and
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     pneumococcal pneumonia immunization; and
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           WHEREAS, the immunization requirements of the Nursing Home Resident and
     Employee Immunization Act of 1999, § 20-10-1301 et seq., allow an exemption
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     for residents and employees when the immunization or vaccine would be
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     medically contraindicated; and
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           WHEREAS, the Nursing Home Resident and Employee Immunization Act of
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     1999, § 20-10-1301 et seq., is ambiguous as to whether an employee of a
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     nursing home facility can request an exemption on grounds that the
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     immunization conflicts with religious tenets and practices of a recognized
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     church or religious denomination of which the employee is a adherent or
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     member; and
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           WHEREAS, the immunization requirements of the Nursing Home Resident and
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     Employee Immunization Act of 1999, § 20-10-1301 et seq., are mandated as a
     condition of employment; and
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           WHEREAS, due to recommendations and mandates by the Centers for Disease
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     Control and Prevention and the federal government, private hospitals, medical
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I.S.P. 2015-047 1 facilities, and other private employers have begun requiring immunizations as 2 a condition of employment; and 3 4 WHEREAS, an adult employee of a private hospital, medical facility, or 5 private employer has few options to assert his or her medical reasons, 6 religious beliefs, or philosophical beliefs concerning immunizations; and 7 8 WHEREAS, an adult employee of a private hospital, medical facility, or 9 private employer often does not have access to a process by which to request an exemption for medical reasons, religious beliefs, or philosophical beliefs 10 11 that conflict with immunization, unlike students or children in the state; 12 and 13 WHEREAS, medical reason, religious belief, and philosophical belief 14 15 exemptions are allowed in Maine for employees of healthcare facilities; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Arkansas does not have a state law that explicitly states that an adult employee of a private hospital, medical facility, or private 18 19 employer may decline immunizations due to medical reasons, religious beliefs, 20 or philosophical beliefs or that an employer cannot require immunizations as 21 a condition of employment; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the General Assembly should protect the rights of employees of

a private hospital, medical facility, or private employer within the state, 24 25 regardless of the medical reasons, religious beliefs, or philosophical 26 beliefs of the employee,

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28 NOW THEREFORE,

29 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL 30 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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32 THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council refer to the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor this proposal to study immunization 33 34 requirements for adult employees of a private hospital, medical facility, or 35 private employer and make recommendations for future legislation. 36

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BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT, upon request, the Department of Health
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     provide assistance to the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and
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     Labor to study immunization requirements for adult employees of a private
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     hospital, medical facility, or private employer.
