1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2015-149 2 REQUESTING THAT THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON AGING, CHILDREN AND YOUTH, 3 4 LEGISLATIVE AND MILITARY AFFAIRS CONDUCT A STUDY TO EXEMPT NEWLY RETIRED MEMBERS OF THE ARKANSAS NATIONAL GUARD OR A RESERVE 5 6 COMPONENT OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES AND RETIRED ACTIVE 7 DUTY MILITARY PERSONNEL FROM CONCEALED HANDGUN LICENSING 8 **REQUIRMENTS.** 9 10 11 WHEREAS, military personnel have recently been targeted victims of gun 12 violence throughout the country, and the safety of military personnel, active 13 duty and retired, is important to the State of Arkansas; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Arkansas Code Annotated § 5-73-301 et seq. and the Concealed 16 Handgun Carry License Rules of the Department of Arkansas State Police 17 require that retired members of the Arkansas National Guard or a reserve component of the United States Armed Forces and retired active duty military 18 19 personnel comply with handgun licensing procedures, which can take up to four 20 (4) months to complete, in order to carry a concealed weapon in the State of 21 Arkansas; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Arkansas Code § 5-73-320 authorizes the Department of Arkansas 24 State Police to issue a concealed handgun carry license to certain members of 25 the Arkansas National Guard or a reserve component of the United States Armed 26 Forces or active duty military personnel; and 27 WHEREAS, Arkansas Code § 5-73-304 exempts former law enforcement 28 29 officers from licensing requirements if otherwise authorized to carry a 30 concealed handgun; similarly, recently retired military personnel who comply 31 with Arkansas Code § 5-73-320(a)(2)(D), or complete mandatory annual or 32 biennial military weapons qualification training prior to their military 33 retirement, should be exempt from state licensing requirements for the first 34 five(5) years following their military retirement, 35 36 NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON AGING, CHILDREN AND YOUTH,
LEGISLATIVE AND MILITARY AFFAIRS OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
STATE OF ARKANSAS:

5 THAT the House Committee on Aging, Children And Youth, Legislative and 6 Military Affairs conduct a study to exempt newly retired members of the 7 Arkansas National Guard or a reserve component of the United States Armed 8 Forces and retired active duty military personnel from concealed handgun 9 licensing requirements for the first five (5) years following their military 10 retirement.
