31	used elsewhere; that other areas of state government are in need of state
32	funding; and that this act is immediately necessary to provide funding for
33	the 2017 fiscal year to ensure the proper administration of important state
34	functions. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
35	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
36	safety shall become effective on:

1	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
2	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
3	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
4	bill; or
5	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
6	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
