13 ENTITIES; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER

25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

27 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-1-303(c)(10), concerning duties of the
28 Arkansas Commission for Coordination of Educational Efforts, is repealed.

29 ~~(10) Make recommendations related to the future need for~~
30 ~~remediation of beginning college students;~~

31
32 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-1-402(5), concerning the School
33 Leadership Coordinating Council, is amended to read as follows:

34 (5) An effective statewide leadership development system will
35 result in increased graduation rates, ~~reduced remediation rates~~, the closing
36 of achievement gaps, increased student and adult performance, increased

1 recruitment of effective leaders, and increased capacity for instructional
2 leaders, and thus will increase the number of Arkansas citizens with
3 bachelor's degrees.

5 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-1-605(a)(1)(D), concerning evaluation of
6 the College and Career Coaches Program, is repealed.

5 the state to participate in the council's plan and to work collaboratively to

34 ~~(1) The total direct and indirect costs of remediation for the~~

~~(b) The department shall develop a system to calculate the total amount of state funds spent on remediation of first time entering freshmen students.~~

~~(c) The amount spent on remediation at public four year educational institutions shall not exceed the amount spent as of the 1996 1997 school year.~~

SECTION 17. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE CODIFIED. FUND TRANSFERS.

(a) Beginning July 1, 2016, and each month thereafter, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and the Auditor of the State the amount listed in the Monthly Deduction column of the Institutions General Revenue Deduction Schedule in subsection (b) of this section from the total monthly allocation of general revenue authorized for distribution in the Revenue Stabilization Act for the four-year institutions, two-year institutions, and technical colleges listed in the Institutions General Revenue Deduction Schedule in subsection (b) of this section in a total annual amount not to exceed the amount listed as Total Annual Deductions in the Institutions General Revenue Deduction Schedule in subsection (b) of this section.

(b) The following four-year institutions, two-year institutions, and technical colleges shall have monthly deductions from general revenue distributions authorized in the Revenue Stabilization Act for a total annual amount listed in the Institutions General Revenue Deduction Schedule.

26 (c) One-fourth (1/4) of the amount deducted monthly under subsection
27 (a) of this section shall be transferred monthly to the Merit Adjustment Fund
28 until the total annual deposited is equal to five million four hundred
29 thousand dollars (\$5,400,000) to supplement cost of living increases or merit
30 adjustment payments to state employees.

31 (d)(1) One-fourth (1/4) of the amount deducted monthly under
32 subsection (a) of this section shall be transferred monthly to a cash fund
33 for the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training until
34 the total annual deposited is equal to three hundred thousand dollars
35 (\$300,000) to provide for up to two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for bonus

1 payments for law enforcement officers employed by the State of Arkansas who
2 complete certified law enforcement training as determined by the commission.

3 (2) The commission shall establish rules for the distribution of
4 the bonus payments.

5 (e)(1) One-fourth (1/4) of the amount deducted monthly under
6 subsection (a) of this section shall be transferred monthly to the Department
7 of Arkansas State Police Fund until the total annual deposited is equal to
8 one million one hundred thousand dollars (\$1,100,000) to provide for up to
9 two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for bonus payments for law enforcement officers
10 completing certified law enforcement training as determined by the Department
11 of Arkansas State Police.

12 (2) The Department of Arkansas State Police shall establish rules
13 for the distribution of bonus payments.

14 (f) One-fourth (1/4) of the amount deducted monthly under subsection
15 (a) of this section shall be transferred monthly to the Arkansas State
16 Highway and Transportation Department Fund to supplement funding for the
17 Arkansas Highway and Transportation Department.

18 (g)(1) Once subsections (d) and (e) of this section are fully funded,
19 any additional monthly transfers in excess of the maximum amount authorized
20 in subsections (d) and (e) of this section shall be deposited to the Merit
21 Adjustment Fund as authorized in subsection (c) of this section until
22 subsection (c) of this section is fully funded.

23 (2) Once subsections (c)-(e) of this section are fully funded,
24 any additional monthly transfers in excess of the maximum amount authorized
25 in subsections (c)-(e) of this section shall be deposited into the State
26 Highway and Transportation Department Fund.

27
28 SECTION 18. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
29 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that state funds used for
30 remediation activities at institutions of higher education could be better
31 used elsewhere; that other areas of state government are in need of state
32 funding; and that this act is immediately necessary to provide funding for
33 the 2017 fiscal year to ensure the proper administration of important state
34 functions. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
35 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
36 safety shall become effective on:

1 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

2 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
3 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
4 bill; or

5 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
6 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
