23	SECTION 1. The purpose of this act concerns home-schooled students
24	participating in public school graduation ceremonies.
25	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 15, Subchapter 5, is amended to
26	add an additional section to read as follows:
27	6-15-510. Participation of home-schooled students in graduation
28	<u>exercises.</u>
29	(a) As used in this section:
30	(1) "Home-schooled student" means a student legally enrolled in
31	<u>an Arkansas home school;</u>
32	<u>(2) "Parent" is a legal guardian or legal custodian;</u>
33	(3) "Resident public school" is the school to which the student
34	would be assigned by the resident public school district; and
35	(4) "Resident public school district" means the public school
36	district in which the home-schooled student's parent resides as determined

1	<u>under § 6-18-202.</u>
2	(b) A resident public school district shall permit a home-schooled
3	student to participate in graduation exercises at the student's resident
4	public school if the student or the student's parent:
5	(1) Provides to the principal a notice of the student's desire
6	to participate in graduation exercises; and
7	(2) Demonstrates in the notice that the student has
8	graduated from the home school.
