1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2017-091 2 REQUESTING THAT THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY STUDY THE 3 4 CASELOADS OF PAROLE OFFICERS, THE STAFFING OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY CORRECTION, THE ELECTRONIC MONITORING POLICIES OF THE 5 6 STATE, THE RELOCATION OF PAROLEES IN THE STATE, AND CERTAIN 7 POTENTIAL POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS. 8 9 WHEREAS, public safety should be the top priority for the state; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the state's goal should be to be the safest state in the 12 nation; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Council of State Governments informed the General Assembly 15 last year that average caseloads for Arkansas parole officers numbered over 16 one hundred twenty (120) cases per parole officer while the average caseload 17 in North Carolina was sixty (60) cases per parole officer; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the report by the Council of State Governments noted that it is particularly important to "focus attention and resources on people who are 20 21 in the early stages of their supervision term" because those are the people 22 who most need the parole officers' time and resources; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the report by the Council of State Governments also noted that 25 high caseloads for parole officers "significantly impede their ability to facilitate behavior change among people on probation or parole"; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, the budget request by the Department of Community Correction 29 for new parole officers included approximately ninety (90) new positions, but 30 no new positions were created; and 31 32 WHEREAS, adding new positions for parole officers would allow for a 33 reduction in the average caseload of the state's parole officers, which would 34 allow the parole officers to focus more of their time and resources on those 35 former inmates recently released from prison to help give them, as they re-36 enter society, the best chance of success; and

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1 2 WHEREAS, violent crime in our capital city has been on the rise, 3 4 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY OF THE NINETY-FIRST 5 6 GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 7 8 THAT the Senate Committee on Judiciary study: 9 (1) Average caseloads for parole officers in the state; (2) Whether additional positions for parole officers should be 10 11 created immediately; 12 (3) Whether additional parole officers should be assigned to certain areas of the state; 13 14 (4) The number of job openings in the Department of Community 15 Correction; 16 (5) The turnover rates at the Department of Community 17 Correction: 18 (6) The electronic monitoring policies of the state, as well as 19 potential policy enhancements, costs, and effectiveness of expanding 20 electronic monitoring to include all parolees convicted of an offense 21 involving violence or home invasion; 22 (7) Where parolees relocate in the state and whether certain 23 areas of the state have a higher number of parolees than other areas; and 24 (8) Potential policy recommendations concerning: 25 (A) Methods of providing former inmates with the best chance of a safe and successful re-entry into society; and 26 27 (B) Means of reducing recidivism and the overall crime 28 rate. 29 30 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT the House Committee on Judiciary be invited 31 to participate in the study. 32 33 Respectfully submitted, 34 35 36
