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1	This subchapter does not require licensure as a genetic counselor of:
2	(1) An individual who is licensed by this state as a healthcare
3	professional and who is practicing within his or her scope of practice;
4	(2) An individual who is employed as a genetic counselor by the
5	federal government if the individual provides genetic counseling solely
6	within the course and the scope of his or her employment; or
7	(3) A student enrolled in an accredited genetic counseling
8	educational program if:
9	(A) The genetic counseling performed by the student is
10	integral to the course of study of the student;
11	(B) The genetic counseling is performed under supervision
12	of a supervisor assigned to supervise the student; and
13	(C) The healthcare facility or supervisor designates on
14	the student's identification badge that the student is as a genetic counselor
15	intern.

18	The Arkansas State Medical Board shall:
19	(1) Develop appropriate rules necessary to regulate genetic
20	counselors;
21	(2) Receive, review, and approve applications for genetic
22	counselor licensure;
23	(3) Issue, renew, suspend, revoke, or deny licensure as a
24	genetic counselor;
25	(4) Conduct hearings on investigative and disciplinary
26	proceedings;
27	(5)(A) Maintain a database of all licensees and all persons

1	A person shall not use or assume the title "licensed genetic counselor"			
2	or use any words, letters, abbreviations, or insignia indicating or implying			
3	that the person holds a genetic counselor license unless the person is			
4	licensed by the Arkansas State Medical Board.			
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6	17-95-1106. Genetic counselor licensure.			
7	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall license as a genetic			
8	counselor an applicant who:			
9	(1) Submits an application approved by the Arkansas State			
10	Medical Board;			
11	(2) Pays an application fee approved by the Arkansas State			
12	Medical Board;			
13	(3) Either:			
14	(A) Provides evidence of certification as:			
15	(i) A genetic counselor by the American Board of			
16	Genetic Counseling or the American Board of Medical Genetics and Genomics; or			
17	(ii) A medical geneticist by the American Board of			
18	Medical Genetics and Genomics; or			
19	(B) Has worked as a genetic counselor for ten (10) years			
20	and provides:			
21	(i) Documentation that the applicant has:			
22	(a) A master's degree or higher in genetics or			
23	<u>a related field of study;</u>			
24	(b) Never failed a certification examination			
25	by the American Board of Genetic Counseling or the American Board of Medical			
26	<u>Genetics and Genomics; and</u>			
27	(c) Attended a continuing education unit			
28	program within the last five (5) years approved by the Arkansas State Medical			
29	Board; and			
30	(ii) Three (3) letters of recommendation from			
31	individuals who have worked with the applicant in an employment setting in			
32	the last ten (10) years and can attest to the competency of the applicant in			
33	providing genetic counseling services.			
34	(b)(l) The Arkansas State Medical Board may issue a license to an			
35	applicant who provides evidence that he or she is licensed to practice as a			
36	genetic counselor in another state or territory if the requirements for			

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1	licensure in the other state or territory are equal to the requirements in		
2	this subchapter.		
3	(2) The issuance of a license by reciprocity shall be at the		
4	sole discretion of the Arkansas State Medical Board.		
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6	17-95-1107. Renewal of genetic counselor license.		
7	(a) Except in the case of a temporary license under § 17-95-1108, a		
8	license shall be valid for a two-year period from the date of issuance.		
9	(b) Upon receipt of a renewal application and renewal fees as		
10	determined by the Arkansas State Medical Board, the board shall renew a		
11	license to practice as a genetic counselor.		
12	(c)(l) As a condition of licensure renewal, a genetic counselor shall		
13	submit documentation that he or she has completed fifty (50) hours of		
14	continuing education units approved by the board.		
15	(2) The board may waive the continuing education requirement or		
16	grant an extension of time to complete the continuing education requirement		
17	upon a finding of good cause based on an emergency or hardship of the		
18	licensee.

21	<u>(a)(l) The Arkansas State Medical Board may issue a temporary license</u>		
22	to an applicant who does not meet the certification requirement in		
23	subdivision (a)(3)(A) of this section if the applicant:		
24	(A) Has been granted an active-candidate status by the		
25	American Board of Genetic Counseling; and		
26	(B) Submits an application and appropriate application		
27	fees with the Arkansas State Medical Board.		
28	(2) A temporary license is valid for one (1) year from the date		
29	of issuance.		
30	(3)(A) A temporary license may be renewed for one (1) year if		
31	the applicant fails on his or her first attempt to pass the certification		
32	examination of the American Board of Genetic Counseling or the American Board		
33	of Medical Genetics and Genomics.		
34	(B) An application for renewal shall be signed by a		
35	supervisor of the applicant.

7	(b) As a condition of temporary licensure, an applicant shall work		
8	under the supervision of a supervisor when the applicant provides genetic		
9	counseling services.		
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11	17-95-1109. Denial, suspension, revocation, or refusal to renew -		
12	<u>Censure.</u>		
13	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board may deny, suspend, revoke, or		
14	refuse to renew a license, or may reprimand, censure, place on probation, or		
15	otherwise discipline a licensee, upon proof that the licensee has:		
16	(1) Obtained or attempted to obtain a license by fraud or		
17	deception;		
18	(2) Been convicted of a felony under state or federal law or		
19	committed any offense involving moral turpitude;		
20	(3) Been adjudicated mentally ill or incompetent by a court;		
21	(4) Used illicit drugs or intoxicating liquors to an extent that		
22	adversely affects the practice of genetic counseling;		
23	(5) Engaged in unethical or unprofessional conduct, including		
24	without limitation willful acts, negligence, or incompetence in the course of		
25	professional practice;		
26	(6) Violated any order or rule of the board; or		
27	(7) Been denied licensure or disciplined in another state or		
28	territory in connection with a license in another state or territory.		
29	(b) A licensee under subsection (a) of this section shall promptly		
30	deliver his or her license to the board if the licensee:		
31	(1) Has his or her license suspended or revoked; or		
32	(2) Surrenders his or her license with or without prejudice if		
33	the surrender is approved by the board.
