1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2019-126 2 3 REQUESTING THAT THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFER TO THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON REVENUE AND TAXATION A STUDY OF THE REDUCTION 4 5 OF SALES AND USE TAXES IN THE STATE. 6 7 WHEREAS, Arkansas has one of the highest sales and use tax rates in the 8 nation; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the state should reduce the burden on taxpayers when possible in a fiscally responsible manner; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the Arkansas Tax Reform and Relief Legislative Task Force studied the state's tax laws and policies to determine how to provide tax 14 15 relief and reform the state's tax laws; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the legislature should continue to study how the state can 18 reduce the sales and use tax rate in a fiscally responsible manner, 19 20 NOW THEREFORE, 21 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE NINETY-SECOND 22 GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 23 24 THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council refer to the House Committee on 25 Revenue and Taxation a study of the possibilities for and effects of reducing 26 the sales and use taxes in the state, including without limitation: 27 (1) The feasibility of reducing the state sales and use tax rate 28 by five-tenths percent (0.5%); 29 (2) The overall cost to general revenue and special revenue 30 resulting from a reduction of the sales and use tax rate; and 31 (3) The possible means of offsetting a reduction in state 32 revenue through savings, income growth, and other means. 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the House Committee on Revenue and Taxation 34 35 invite the Senate Committee on Revenue and Taxation to meet jointly to conduct the study of the reduction of sales and use taxes in the state. 36
