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2	<u>23-79-2102. Definitions.</u>	
3	As used in this subchapter:	
4	(1) "Cost-sharing payment" means the total amount a covered	
5	person is required to pay for a service that is covered under the health	
6	benefit plan of the covered person;	
7	(2)(A) "Covered person" means a person who is and continues to	
8	be eligible for coverage under a health benefit plan and is covered under the	
9	health benefit plan.	
10	(B) "Covered person" includes a policyholder, subscriber,	
11	participant, or other individual covered by a health benefit plan, including	
12	a participant in the Arkansas Medicaid Program;	
13	(3)(A) "Health benefit plan" means an individual, blanket, or	
14	group plan, policy, or contract for healthcare services issued or delivered	
15	by an insurer that provides coverage for healthcare services.	
16	(B) "Health benefit plan" includes:	
17	(i) An indemnity or managed care plan;	
18	<u>(ii) A nonfederal governmental plan as defined in 29</u>	
19	U.S.C. § 1002(32), as it existed on January 1, 2020; and	
20	(iii) The Arkansas Medicaid Program.	
21	(C) "Health benefit plan" does not include:	
22	(i) A disability income plan;	
23	(ii) A credit insurance plan;	
24	(iii) Insurance coverage issued as a supplement to	
25	<u>liability insurance;</u>	
26	(iv) A medical payment under an automobile or	
27	homeowners insurance plan;	
28	(v) A health benefit plan provided under Arkansas	
29	Constitution, Article 5, § 32; the Workers' Compensation Law, § 11-9-101 et	
30	seq.; or the Public Employee Workers' Compensation Act, § 21-5-601 et seq.;	
31	(vi) A plan that provides only indemnity for	
32	hospital confinement;	
33	(vii) An accident-only plan;	
34	(viii) A specified disease plan;

36	(x) A dental-only plan; or

2	(4) "Healthcare professional" means a person who is licensed,
3	certified, or otherwise authorized by the laws of this state to administer
4	health care in the ordinary course of the practice of his or her profession;
5	(5) "Insurer" means an insurance company that is licensed,
6	registered, or otherwise authorized to do business under the insurance laws
7	of this state;
8	(6) "Remote patient monitoring" means the use of synchronous or
9	asynchronous electronic information and communication technologies to collect
10	personal health information and medical data from a patient at an originating
11	site that is transmitted to a healthcare professional at a distant site for
12	use in the treatment and management of medical conditions that require
13	frequent monitoring; and
14	(7) "Virtual telephone visit" means a consultation conducted
15	through the use of electronic information and communication technologies to
16	deliver healthcare services, including without limitation the assessment,
17	diagnosis, consultation, treatment, education, care management, and
18	instruction in self-management of a patient.

20	23-79-2103. Coverage for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
21	(a) A health benefit plan, insurer, and the Arkansas Medicaid Program
22	shall provide coverage of virtual telephone visits between a healthcare
23	professional and a covered person to provide remote patient monitoring and
24	healthcare services.
25	(b) If the Governor declares a disaster emergency under the Arkansas
26	Emergency Services Act of 1973, § 12-75-101 et seq., or the Governor orders
27	the State Board of Health to take action under § 20-7-110(b) to prevent the
28	spread of an epidemic or contagious disease, a health benefit plan or insurer
29	shall:
30	(1) Provide coverage to a covered person for testing for
31	coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19); and
32	(2) Not require prior authorization for testing for coronavirus
33	disease 2019 (COVID-19) provided to a covered person.
34	(c) If the Governor declares a disaster emergency under the Arkansas
35	Emergency Services Act of 1973, § 12-75-101 et seq., or the Governor orders
36	the State Board of Health to take action under § 20-7-110(b) to prevent the

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1	spread of an epidemic or contagious disease, a health benefit plan that is		
2	licensed by the State Insurance Department or an insurer shall require		
3	reasonable reimbursement for testing costs to a healthcare professional that		
4	is required to test patients under a directive issued by the State Department		
5	of Health pursuant to § 20-7-110(b).		
6	(d) This section does not prohibit an insurer from collecting a		
7	deductible, copay, or cost-sharing payment from a covered person according to		
8	the health benefit plan.		
9			
10	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
11	<u>General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the lack of health insurance</u>		
12	coverage has limited the number of Arkansans seeking testing for coronavirus		
13	disease 2019 (COVID-19) and is creating uncertainty for Arkansans, causing		
14	unnecessary and undue stress; that requiring coverage of testing and reducing		
15	the restrictions on obtaining testing could encourage additional testing and		
16	thereby reduce the spread of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Arkansas;		
17	and that this act is immediately necessary because Arkansans need access to		
18	testing for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) in order to move freely and		
19	safely in Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this		
20	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,		
21	health, and safety shall become effective on:		
22	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
23	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
24	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
25	bill; or		
26	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
27	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
