10	AN ACT TO AMEND THE DEFINITION OF "PRACTICE OF
11	PHARMACY" TO ALLOW PHARMACISTS TO PRESCRIBE,
12	ADMINISTER, DELIVER, DISTRIBUTE, OR DISPENSE ANTI-
13	ALLERGY MEDICATIONS, VACCINES, OR IMMUNIZATIONS TO A
14	PERSON WHO IS THREE (3) YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER; AND
15	FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

19	TO ALLOW PHARMACISTS TO PRESCRIBE,
20	ADMINISTER, DELIVER, DISTRIBUTE, OR
21	DISPENSE ANTI-ALLERGY MEDICATIONS,
22	VACCINES, OR IMMUNIZATIONS TO A PERSON
23	WHO IS THREE (3) YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER.
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26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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28	SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. Legislative findings and intent.
29	(a) The General Assembly finds that:
30	(1) The federal Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act,
31	Pub. L. No. 109-148, also known as the "PREP Act", and amendments to the act
32	made by the United States Department of Health and Human Services have
33	created confusion as to the scope of practice of pharmacists;
34	(2) Under federal law, a licensed pharmacist may prescribe,
35	administer, deliver, distribute, or dispense to or for a person three (3)
36	years of age or older an anti-allergy medications that treat adverse

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1	reactions associated with the administration of vaccines and immunizations,
2	vaccines, and immunizations that has been authorized or licensed by the
3	United States Food and Drug Administration;
4	(3) Pharmacists licensed in this state are not presently
5	authorized to administer vaccines or immunizations to a person under seven
6	(7) years of age;
7	(4) Confusion exists among the citizens of this state regarding
8	the age at which a pharmacist may administer a vaccine or immunization to a
9	child in this state; and
10	(5) It is in the best interest of the citizens of this state to
11	ensure that the scope of practice of pharmacists is not more restrictive than
12	the scope of practice of pharmacists permitted under federal law.
13	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to authorize pharmacists
14	licensed in this state to prescribe, administer, deliver, distribute, or
15	dispense anti-allergy medications that treat adverse reactions associated
16	with the administration of vaccines and immunizations, vaccines, and
17	immunizations to or for a person three (3) years of age or older.
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19	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-92-101(17)(A)(i), concerning the
20	definition of "practice of pharmacy", is amended to read as follows:
21	(i)(a) Dispensing, selling, distributing,
22	transferring possession of, vending, bartering, or, in accordance with rules
23	adopted by the Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy, administering drugs,
24	medicines, poisons, or chemicals that under the laws of the United States or
25	the State of Arkansas may be sold or dispensed only on the prescription and
26	order of a practitioner authorized by law to prescribe drugs, medicines,
27	poisons, or chemicals.
28	(b) Except as limited by rules adopted by the
29	Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy, a pharmacist has the ability to administer
30	medications.
31	(c) Influenza vaccines and influenza
32	immunizations may be administered to a person seven (7) years of age or older
33	under a general written protocol.
34	(d) Vaccines and immunizations other than
35	influenza vaccines and influenza immunizations may be administered to a
36	person from seven (7) years of age to eighteen (18) years of age under a

1	general written protocol and subject to reporting required under § 20-15-1203
2	if written consent of the parent or legal guardian of the minor is obtained
3	before the administration of the vaccine or immunization.
4	(e) Vaccines and immunizations other than
5	influenza vaccines and influenza immunizations may be administered to a
6	person eighteen (18) years of age or older under a general written protocol.
7	(f) Medications other than vaccines and
8	immunizations may be administered to a person seven (7) years of age or older
9	under a patient-specific order or prescription and subject to reporting of
10	the administration to the prescribing physician.
11	(c) A pharmacist may prescribe, administer,
12	deliver, distribute, or dispense anti-allergy medications that treat adverse
13	reactions associated with the administration of vaccines and immunizations,
14	vaccines, and immunizations to or for a person three (3) years of age or
15	<u>older.</u>
16	(d)(l) A pharmacist may administer medications
17	other than anti-allergy medications that treat adverse reactions associated
18	with the administration of vaccines and immunizations, vaccines, and
19	immunizations under a patient-specific order or prescription or general
20	written protocol.
21	(2) The administration of the medication
22	under subdivision (17)(A)(i)(d)(l) of this section is subject to reporting to
23	the prescribing physician, if applicable.
24	<del>(g)<u>(</u>e)</del> A general written protocol <del>under</del>
25	subdivisions (17)(A)(i)(c) and (e) of this section and patient-specific
26	orders or prescriptions under subdivisions (17)(A)(i)(d) and (f) subdivision
27	(17)(A)(i)(d) of this section shall be from a physician licensed by the
28	Arkansas State Medical Board and practicing in Arkansas or within fifty (50)
29	miles of the Arkansas border.
30	(h)(f) Under a statewide protocol, a
31	pharmacist may initiate therapy and administer or dispense, or both, drugs
32	that include Naloxone and nicotine replacement therapy products;
