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5	WHEREAS, as of October 2021, there are fifty (50) speech-language
6	pathologists in Arkansas who are certified as both speech-language
7 8	pathologists and are teachers working in public schools; and
9	WHEREAS, Medicaid funds generated by speech-language pathologists could
10	be utilized to fund budgets to reimburse speech-language pathologists for
11	gaining the speech-language pathologist licensure that is required to bill
12	Medicaid or to recognize the contribution of speech-language pathologists to
13	public schools by funding a stipend commensurate with stipends received by
14	public school teachers who have received National Board Certifications and
15	certified speech-language pathologists who meet certain teaching-related
